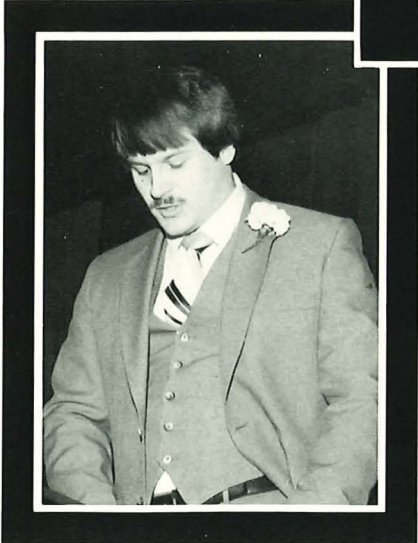
HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTION

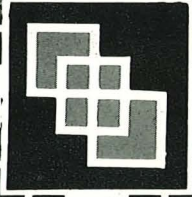
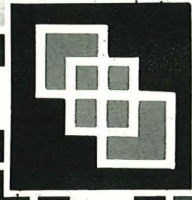


SCHOLASTIC AWARDS

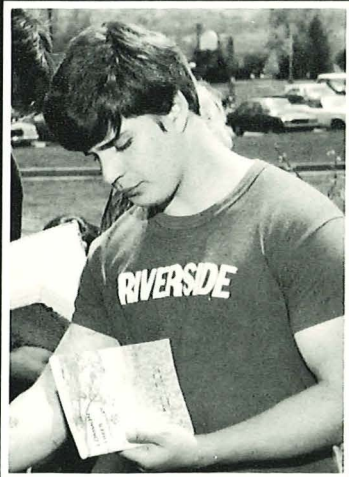
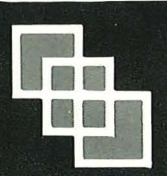


ANTHROPOLOGY

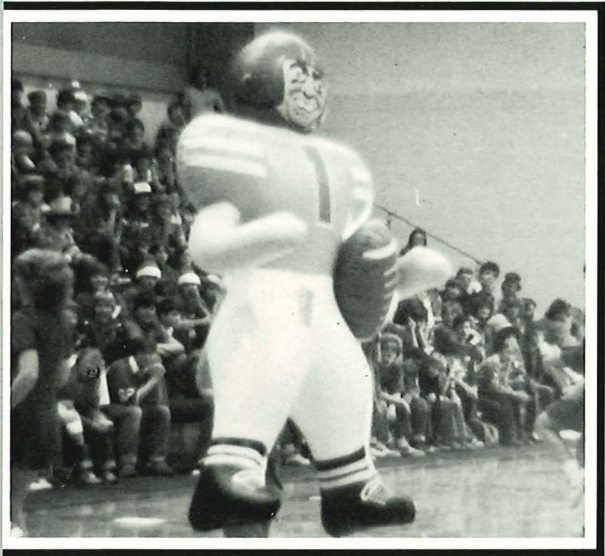
jans of North Pocono hit paydirt. The final score of that game was Riverside 31, Trojans 7.

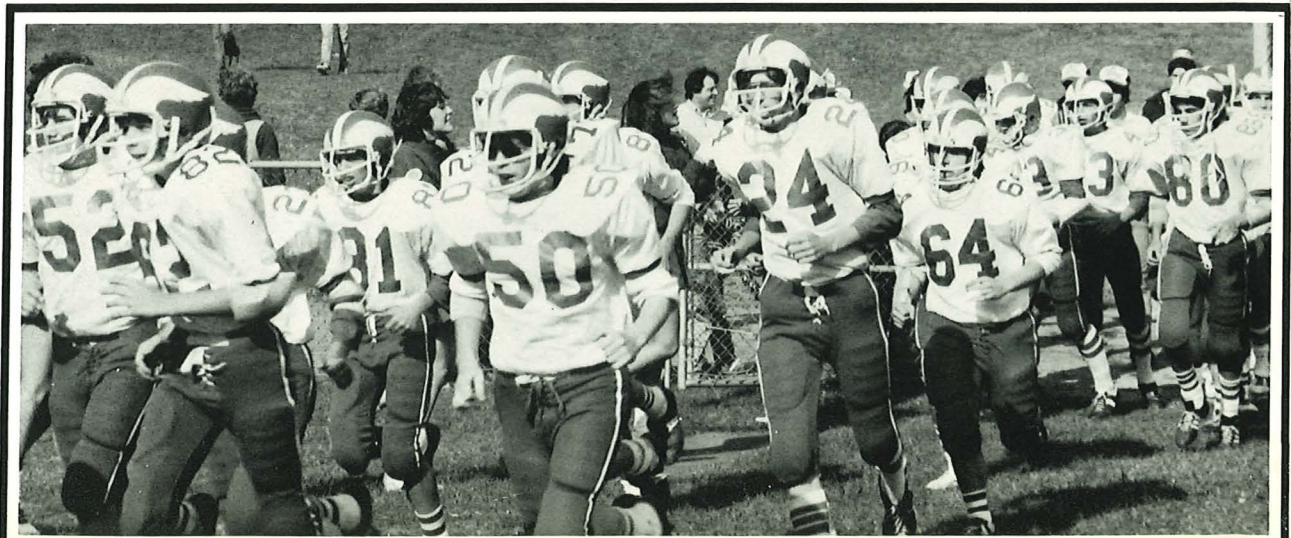
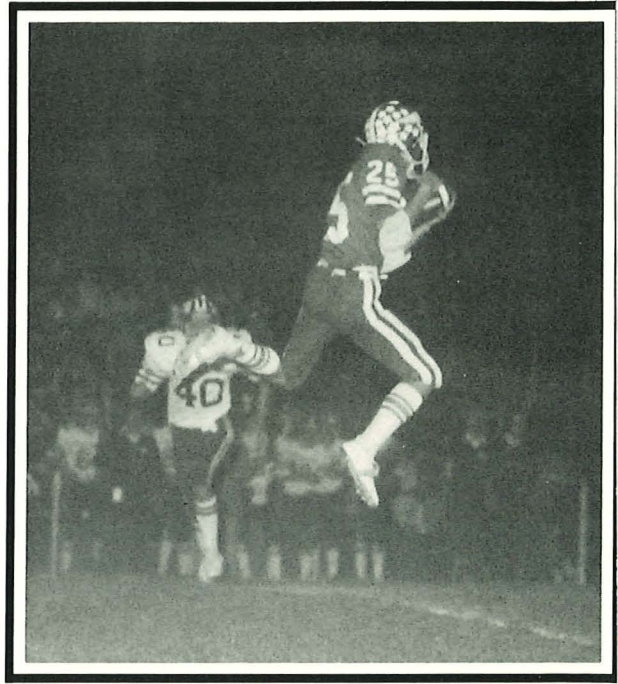
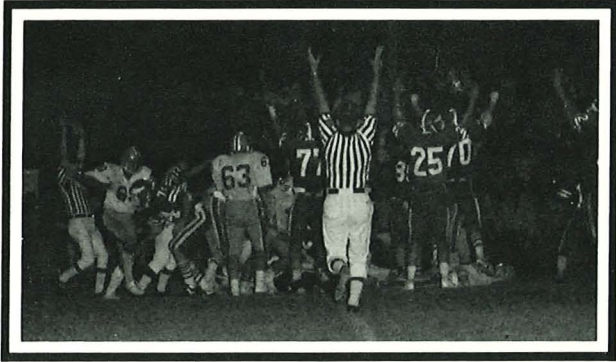
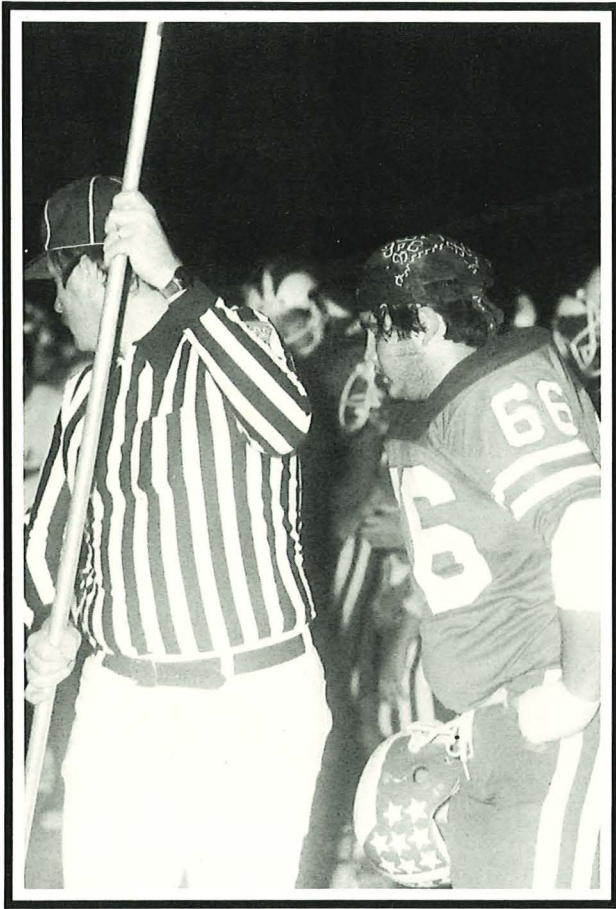

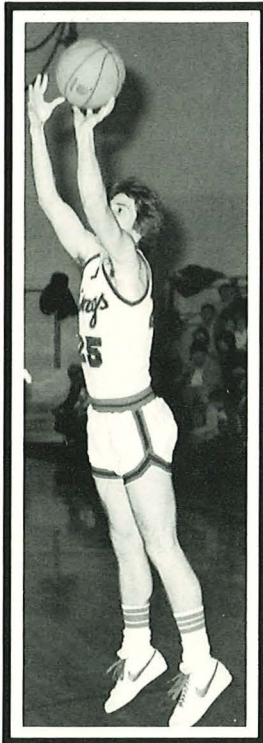
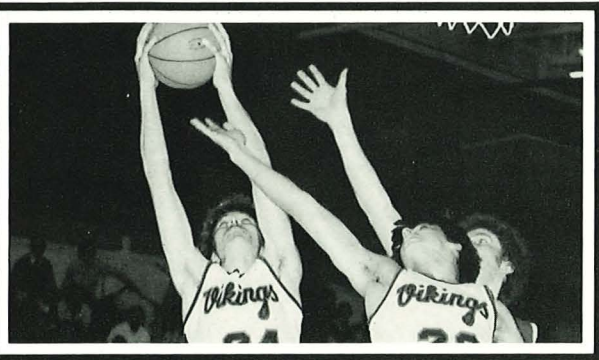
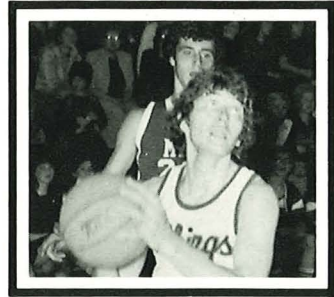
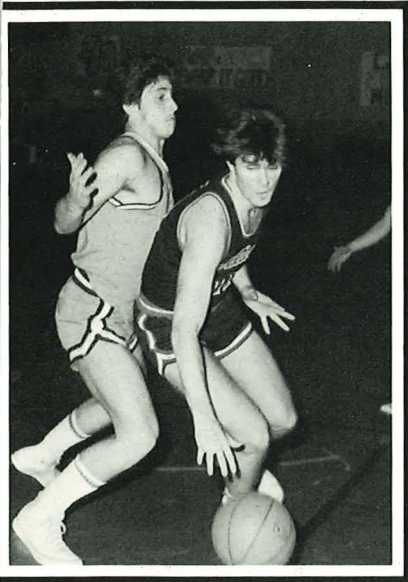
After losing many valuable senior players this season, Coach Hank Butcher hopes to rebuild the team into championship material.

The J.V. Lady Vikes also showed their true ability by reaching the championship game of their league. Both teams should be commended for their outstanding performances.

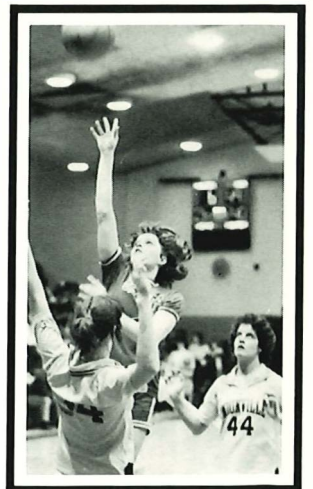
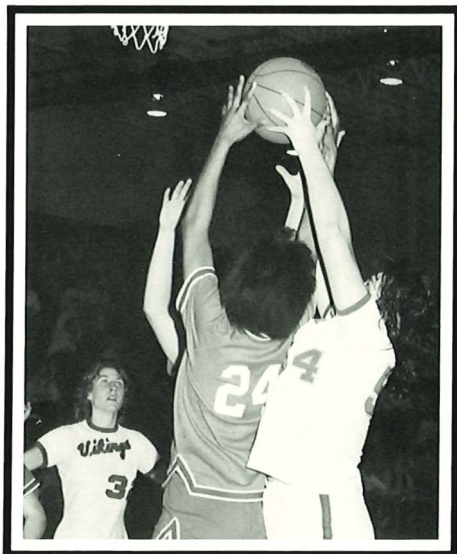
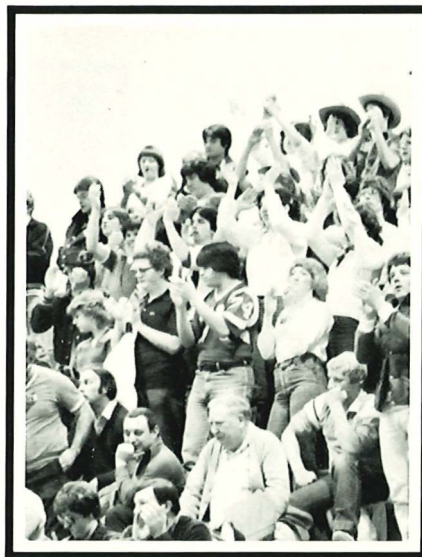


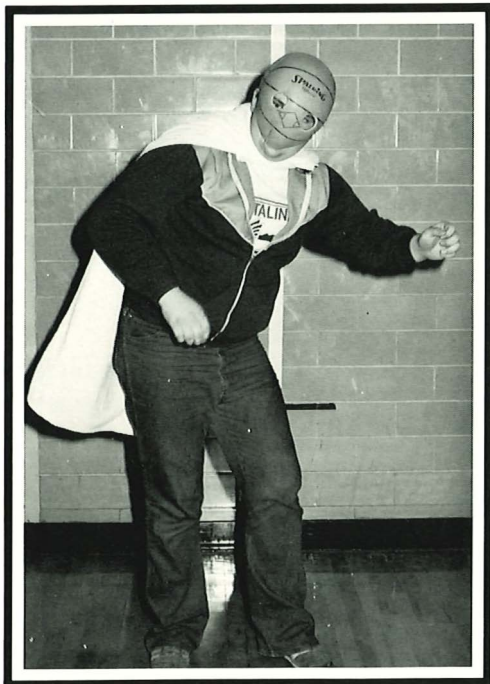
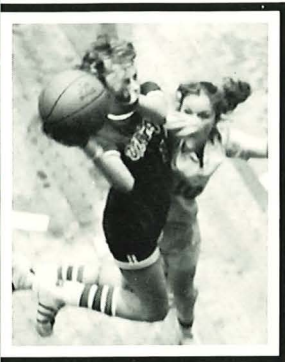
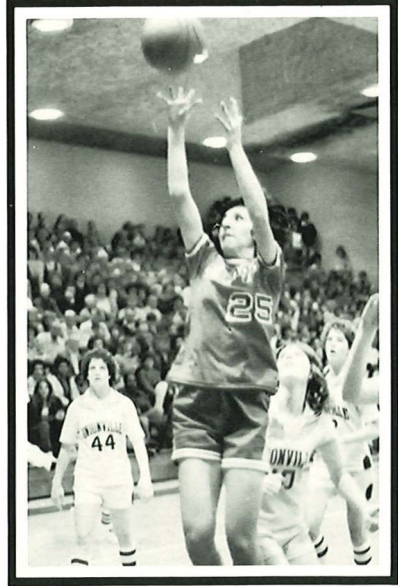
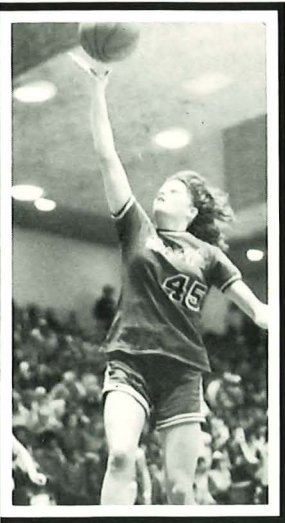




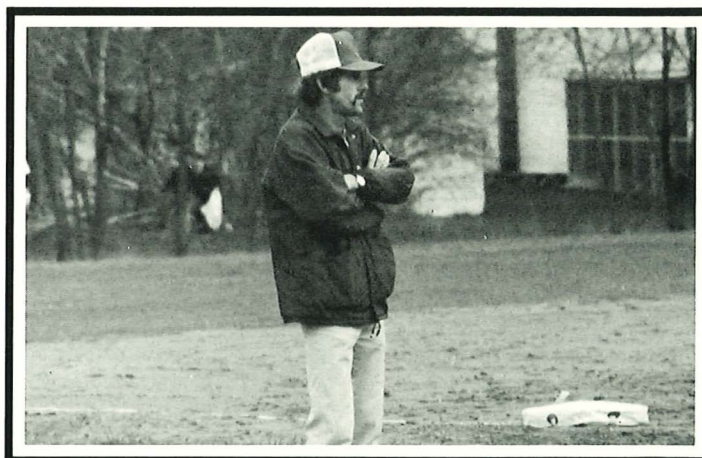
