Paul shall forever be remembered by his classmates with loving and endearing thoughts. In his too short a lifetime his quiet and friendly manners made him a friend to his classmates and his teachers. No words or deeds of his ever offended anyone no matter the provocation.

This troubled planet we live on would be a tranquil home for mankind if everyone had his tolerance and understanding of his fellow man. His kindness, especially to his younger and less fortunate schoolmates and friends shall always be a shining example for the living to exemplify.

An excellent insight as to how our most capable Supervising Principal feels about education and life in general can be gleaned from excerpts from his first speech as Supervising Principal to the faculty and student body of Taylor-Moosic:

"EDUCATION has gone big time and anything in that category takes a lot of money to run. Inasmuch then that this school business is expensive we have to take it seriously. Students very often take it lightly even though the commodity they are buying is precious. This is the only business in the world in which you can find a buyer who is willing to accept less than what he pays for. We want YOU to get your money's worth. In fact if you are a sharp trader you can get more than what you pay for. We urge you to strive for excellence (which is the only worthwhile goal) so that you can shake off the curse of mediocrity and reach that point in your development where you can derive the satisfaction and the joy of accomplishment. A job well done whatever it is, is a credit to you and all those associated with you."

"It is our earnest desire that you learn here in school the democratic way of life--to experience it, to practice it, to make it a part of your school life. Freedom, self-government, is not a gift, it is an achievement. You cannot get freedom simply by being released from adult control. Freedom is achieved as each one of you learns self-control which raises you above the necessity of social control. As you learn to accept the responsibility for your own behavior in the degree will you achieve the freedom that comes from study--hard study. What else will release you from the bondage of ignorance? How can you enjoy the freedom of self-expression if you fail to master language or one of the other arts?"

"Any activity set up here as a part of OUR school program must have a good reason for its existence. Its purpose must be sound and in keeping with good school practice."

"There is so much enrichment, adventure, challenge, in the world of good books. Cultivate a love for wholesome reading and you will never be lonesome. The spirit of inquiry, so much needed if you are to grow and expand mentally, can be nurtured with a good library close at hand."

"If you are to get your money's worth of education in this super market of ideas and information you must know the value of what you're buying. The experience of the human race has proved that there is value in everything that we have to offer here. That value may be practical--what you can actually use in living or earning a living or it may be cultured--that is, it may affect your thinking, your behavior, your manner of life, your attitude towards others, or it may just give you knowledge about people and the world in which we live or it may be learning just for the sake of learning which provides mental discipline."

"Cultivate a healthy attitude towards life and its problems. The teacher is on your side in the struggle to learn."

"Whether you realize it or not you are making a record of your performance that will follow you through much of your early maturity. The Biblical statement "The way of the transgressor is hard" is just as true now as it was when it was written."
