CAASPP Information

The CAASPP is the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. It is a statewide assessment system that measures student skills in English language arts, mathematics, and science. The scores provide information to students, teachers, and families about their academic progress and readiness for college or career readiness.

You can learn more about the <u>English and Math assessments</u> and the <u>Science test</u>. This information includes access to sample and practice tests.

In April, we will begin the state testing called CAASPP with ALL juniors.CAST (Science) Exam:April 1 – April 3CAASPP ELA:April 22 – April 25 (English Classes)CAASPP Math:April 28 – May 2 (Social Science Classes)

There are many reasons that it is important for our students to do their best on these assessments. Many colleges are reviewing this information. A component of earning the Seal of Biliteracy is based on CAASPP scores. Taking these assessments and doing well allows for high placement in courses in college. There are many more reasons to do well on these tests. Please encourage your students to put forth their best effort.



Graduation Robe Adornment There are strict rules and regulations for the graduation ceremony, and this includes adornments. There will be no add-ons/adornments to the graduation robes, with the exception of school issued awards or tribal regalia or recognized objects of religious/cultural significance. Students who desire to wear such adornments shall seek permission at least 14 days before the graduation ceremony. The

deadline for requesting approval is Thursday, May 15th by 4 pm. You must make your request using this form.

Regarding Official Transcripts: Any senior ordering/placing official transcript requests through Parchment requesting they be submitted to a scholarship are being released. Those who are submitting transcript requests for universities and colleges are being placed on hold for final grades unless informed otherwise.

Counselors Corner

Counselors have met with students at Lincoln High School and 8th Grade Sites for registration for the 2025-2026 School year. We encourage students to finish the rest of the 2024-2025 school year strong as final semester grades will be reviewed to determine if students are still eligible to take the courses they originally selected at Registration.

Students have also been signed up for summer school and will receive more information in the coming weeks.

As the end of the school year approaches, students may begin to feel increased stress and/or anxiety with upcoming assignments and/or exams. Below are a list of Calming Techniques your teens can use to help during this time:

1. Relaxation Techniques:

- **Deep Breathing**: Practice slow, deep breaths to calm the nervous system and reduce anxiety.
- Yoga: Incorporating toga can help reduce stress and teach breathing techniques.

2. Mindfulness:

• **Pay Attention to the Present:** Focus on your senses and surroundings to become more aware of the present moment. Stay focuses on today and not become overwhelmed with the future. Take one day at a time.

3. Creating a Calming Environment:

- **Calming Corner:** Designate a quiet space where teens can retreat to de-stress and relax.
- **Relaxing Atmosphere:** Create a calming environment at home with soft lighting, comfortable furniture, and nature-related decor.

4. Staying Connected:

- **Connect with Friends:** Encourage teens to schedule time to hang out with friends, join social groups, or participate in activities.
- **Talk About Feelings:** Provide a safe space for teens to share their feelings and anxieties and listen without judgment.

5. Prioritizing Sleep:

- **Catch Up on Sleep:** Use Spring Break to catch up on sleep and establish a healthy sleep schedule.
- **Sleep Hygiene:** Establish good sleep habits, such as avoiding screen time before bed and creating a dark, quiet sleep environment.

6. Engaging in Enjoyable Activities:

- **Reading:** Engage in reading for pleasure to expand your mind and explore new ideas.
- Gardening: Get involved in gardening to engage in a calming and rewarding activity.
- **Physical Activity:** Encourage teens to engage in physical activities like walking, running, or swimming to relieve stress and improve mood.
- Visit a Museum: Explore local museums to discover new interests and engage in creative activities.
