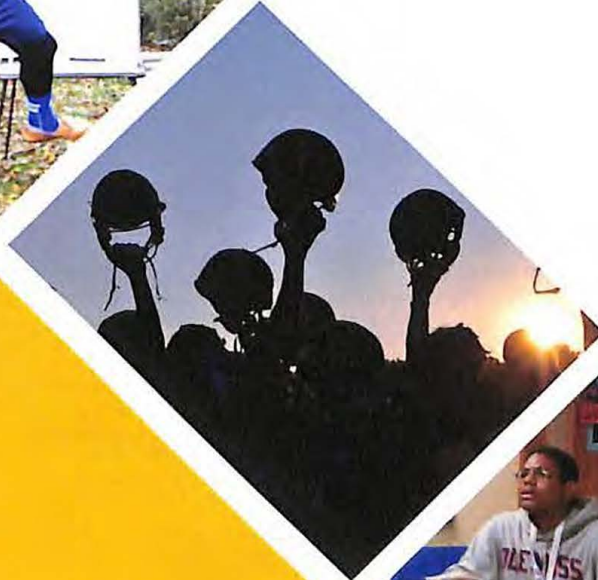

Maybe the challenge of losing an old one.

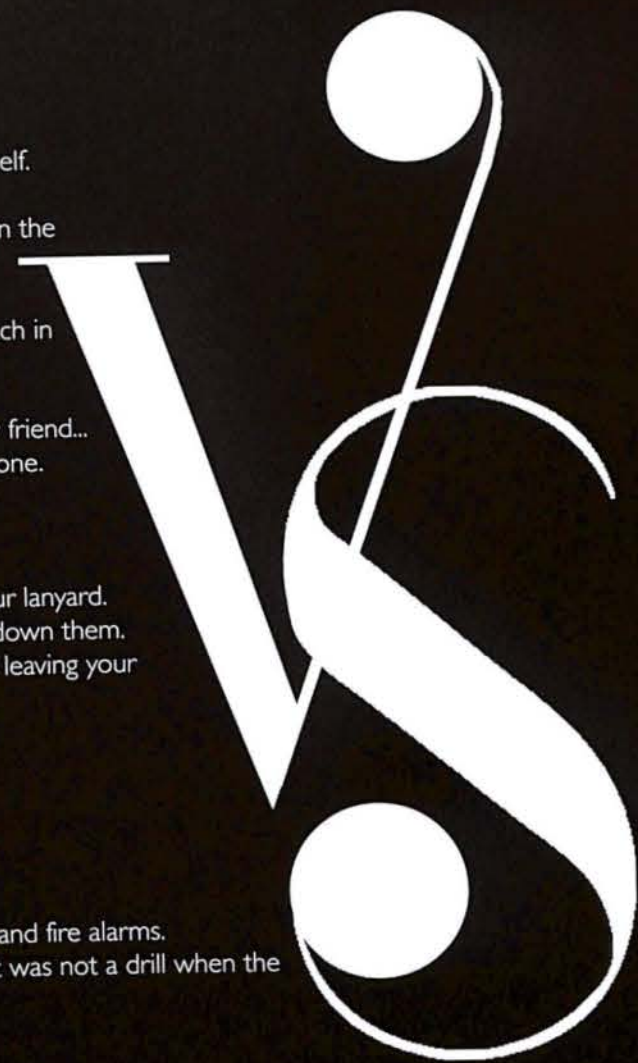

Getting all superior ratings in band and choir.

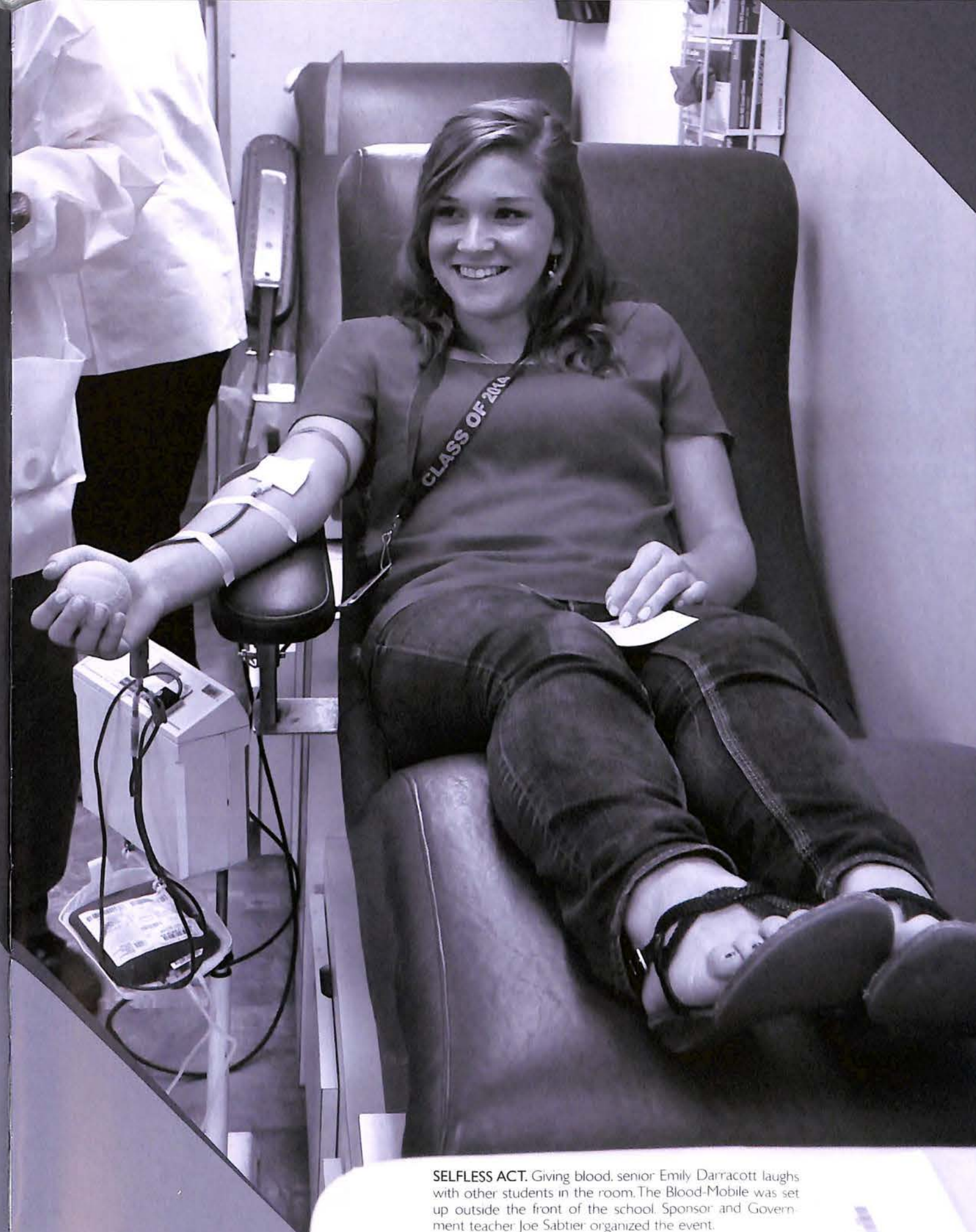
Versus.

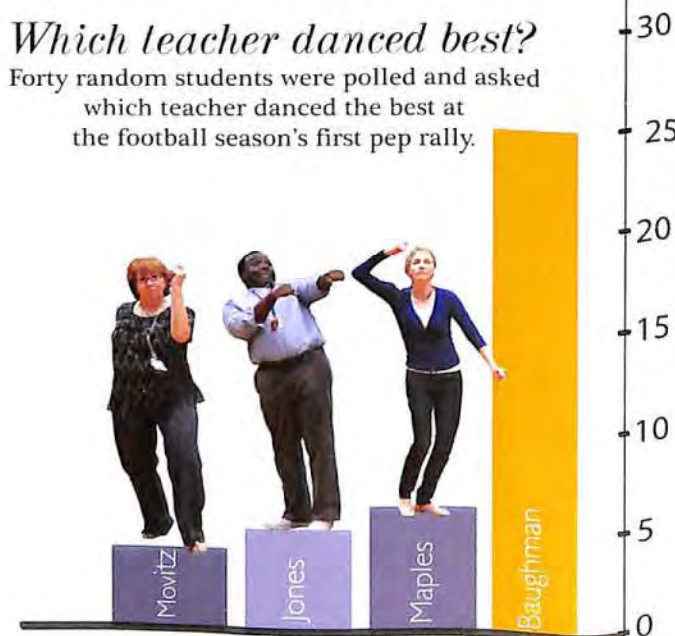

Taking it on the Road takes Big Bucks

Theatre group attends International Fringe Festival for 4th time

Traveling with the theatre is not cheap. With thousands of dollars raised through performances, raffles, t-shirt sales, bake sales and a haunted house, the theatre department is attending the FRINGE International Theatre Festival.

Sending 12 students to Scotland comes at a price—about \$6,000 each—so members of theatre and their parents have spent long hours planning and raising money to send the students. The major fundraising event of the year was the performance of "Grease" raising \$12,000 in ticket sales, along with another \$3,000 from the sale of "T-Bird" and "Pink Lady" T-shirts and a raffle for a guitar.

"Whenever you are needing money in theatre, you

do one of two things, you do 'Grease' or 'The Sound of Music,' theatre director John Davenport said.

Only one fundraiser wasn't enough. The second biggest fundraiser of the year was an asylum-themed haunted house. After weeks of trying to find the perfect place, they found an empty store to rent and use for the event. Over 20 students worked on the haunted house, raising another \$3,200.

Hoping to bring back awards like in previous years, the group traveling overseas started rehearsal in the spring for their performance of "Wizard of Oz."

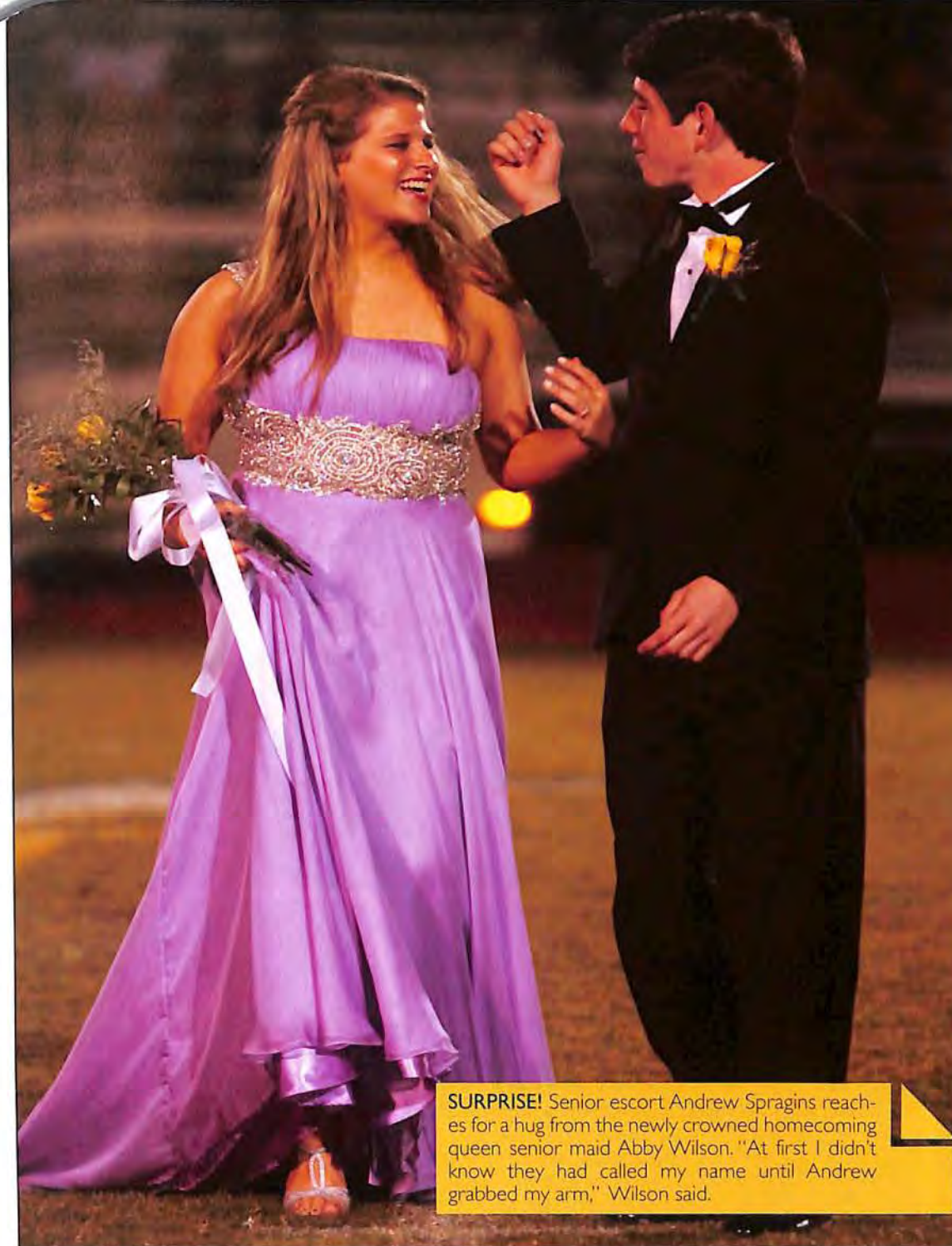

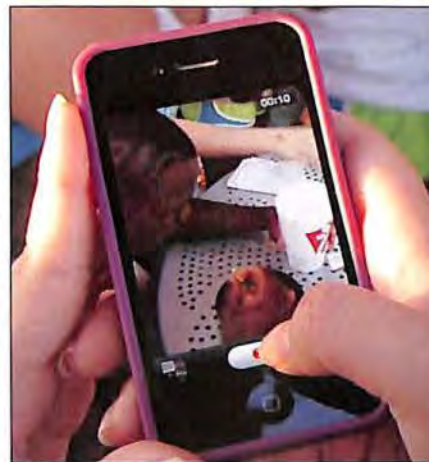

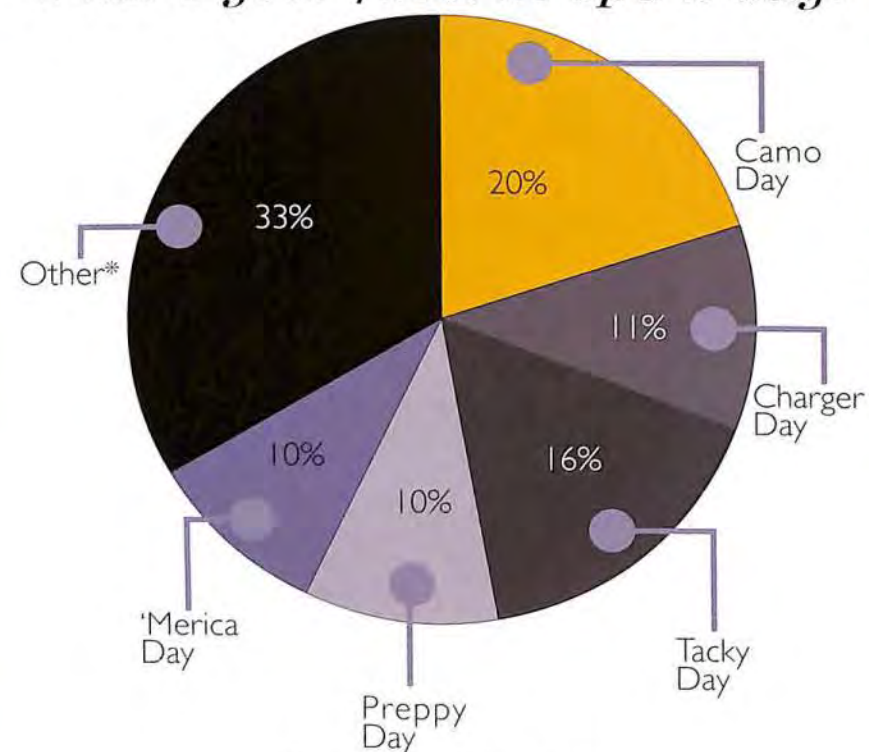

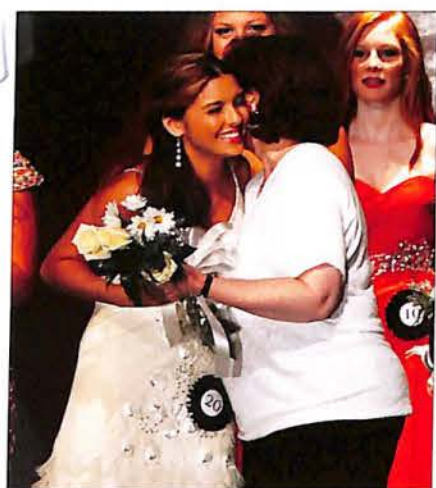

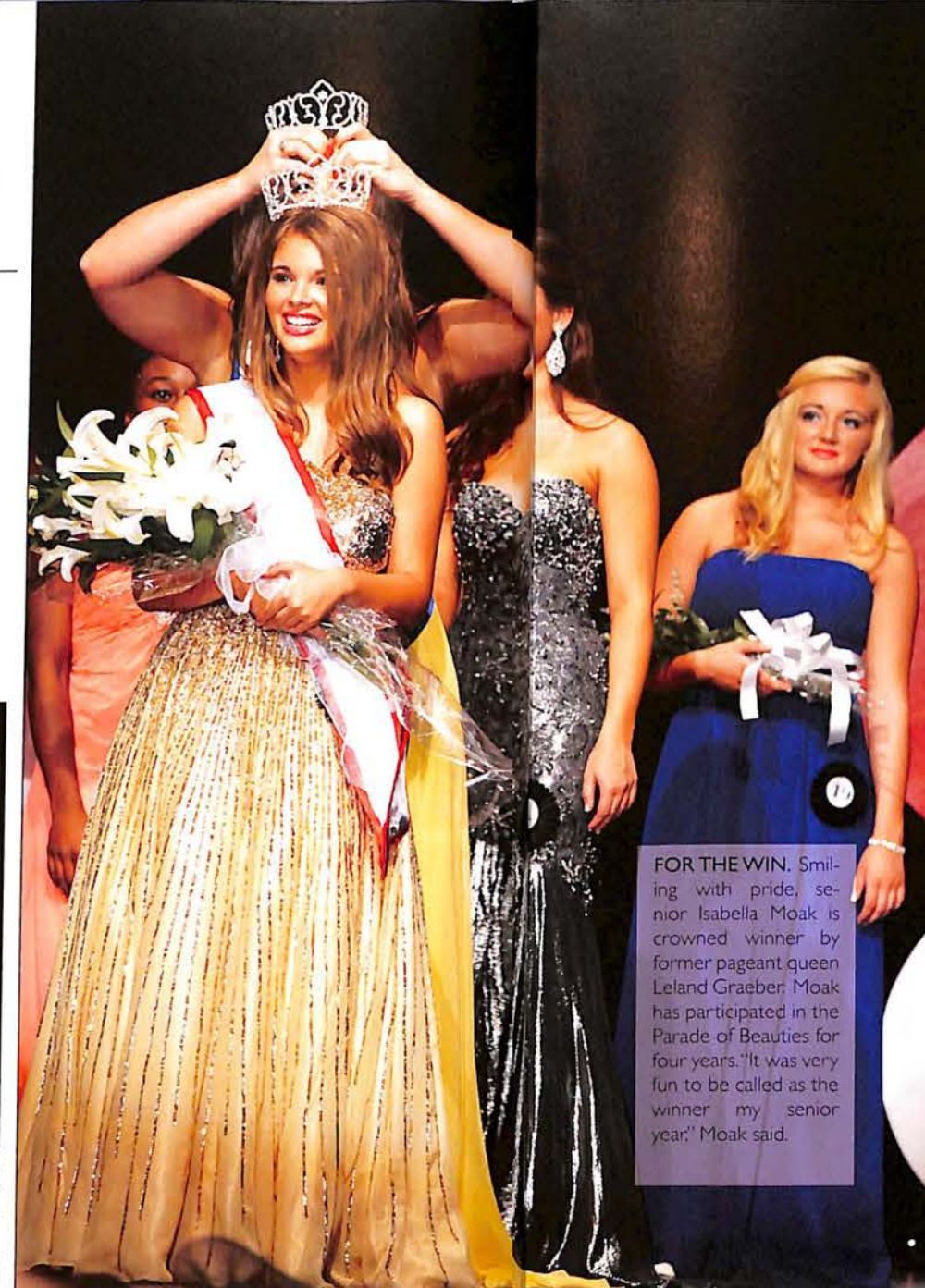

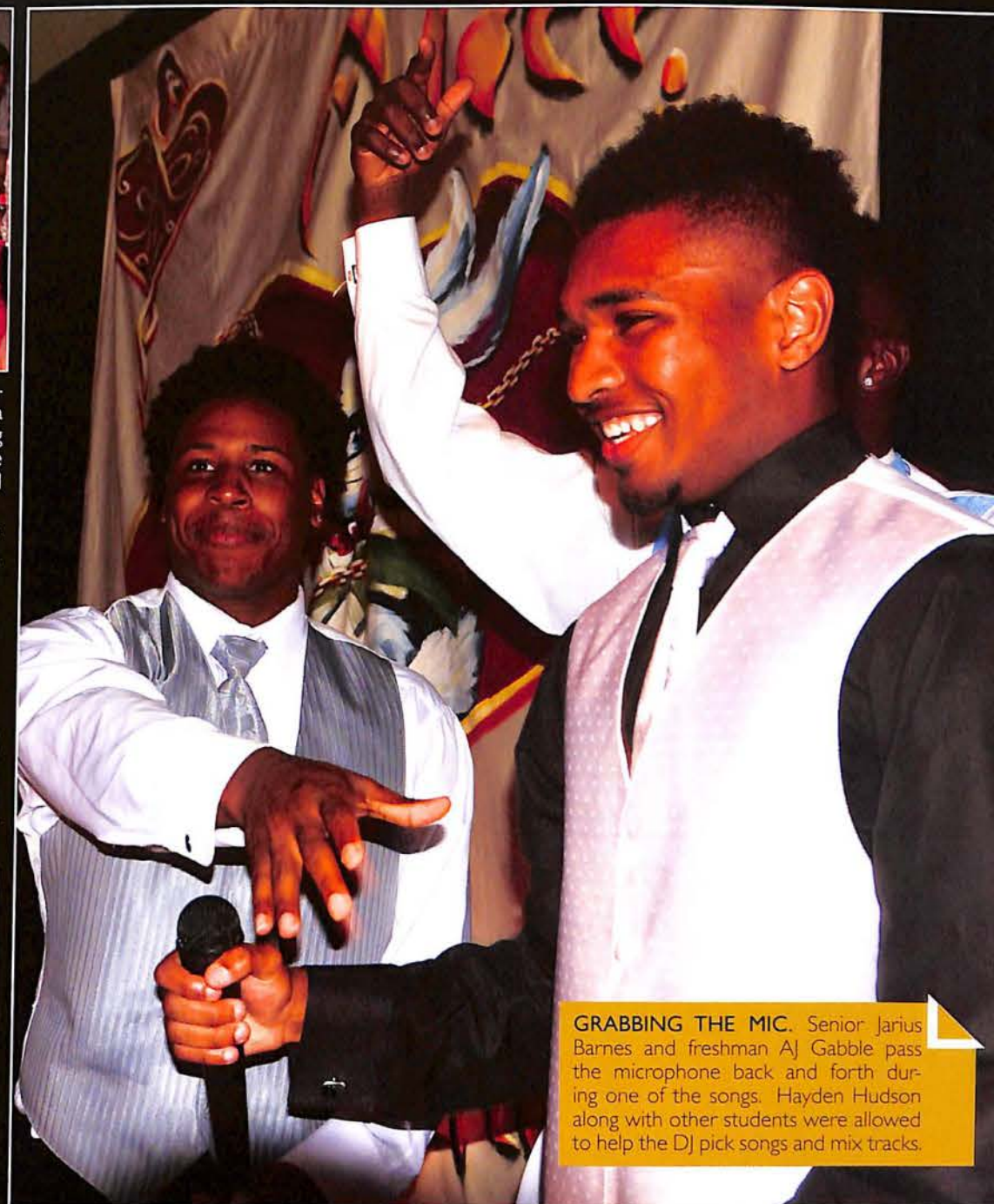

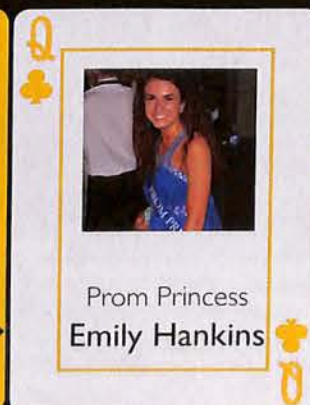
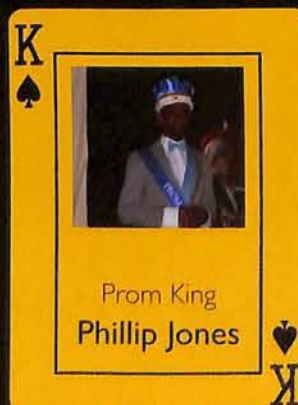

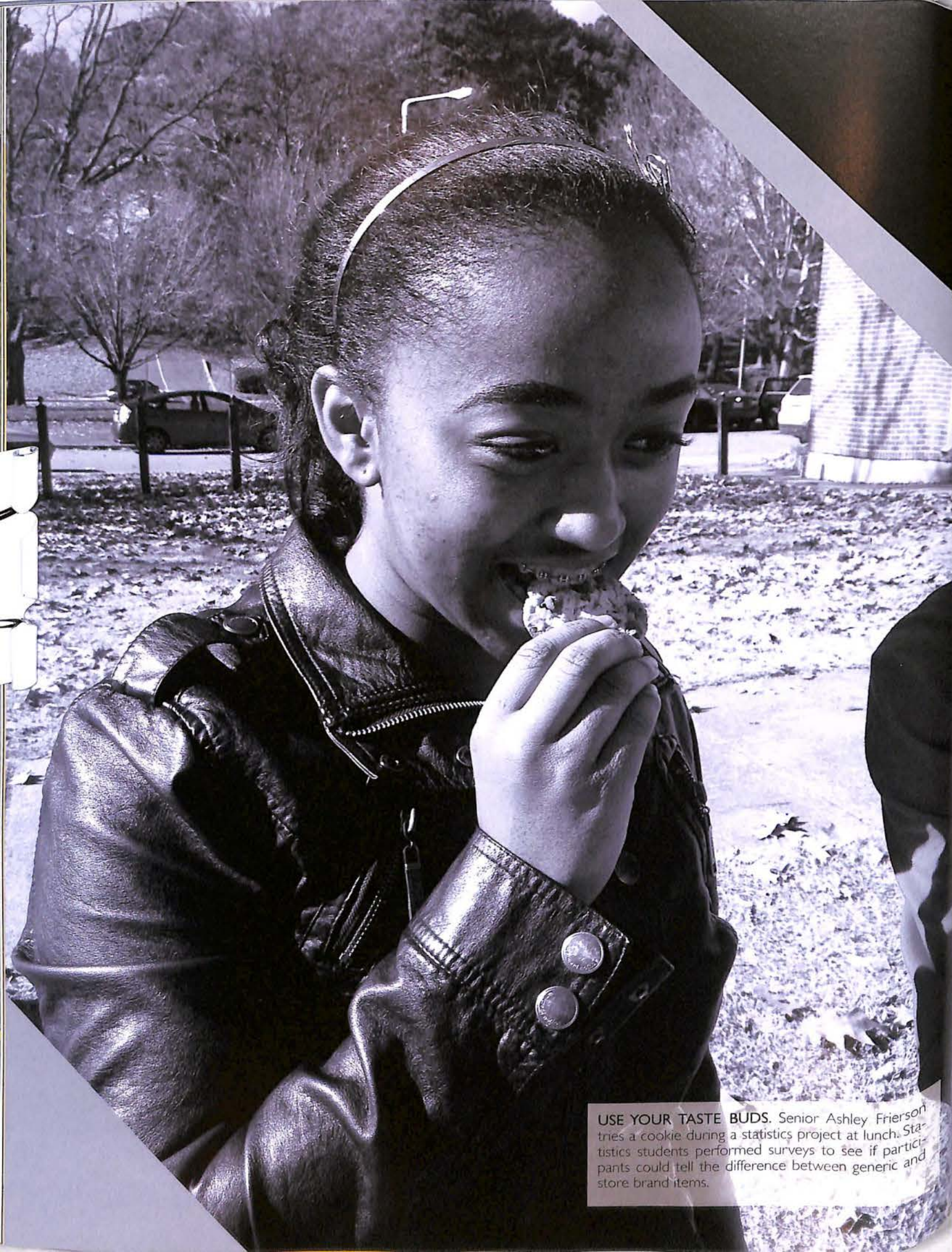

NEW COMPUTERS MEAN NEW TEACHING STYLES

One of the many changes that will occur next year is the introduction of the One-to-One Initiative which will allow each student to have a MacBook Air laptop to use at school or home. OHS already has four laptop carts and one ipad cart for teachers to check out for class use, but the One-to-One Initiative is a more modern approach, according to English teacher Amanda Witt.

"Students grow up with laptops and are technologically advanced," Witt said. "We (teachers) should adapt our teaching to younger generations."

But students are not the only ones with changes.

"The school will have lots of changes for teachers," Witt said. For instance, they will have to

use textbooks online, and they will change teaching methods to go along with the new laptops.

It will be different; it is another challenge we will have to overcome, by adapting and changing how we move around the room and other things."

All in all, Witt sees the new technology as a positive move.

"The One-to-One Initiative is different and people are afraid of different," Witt said. But, she says she wants to see the change for the students.

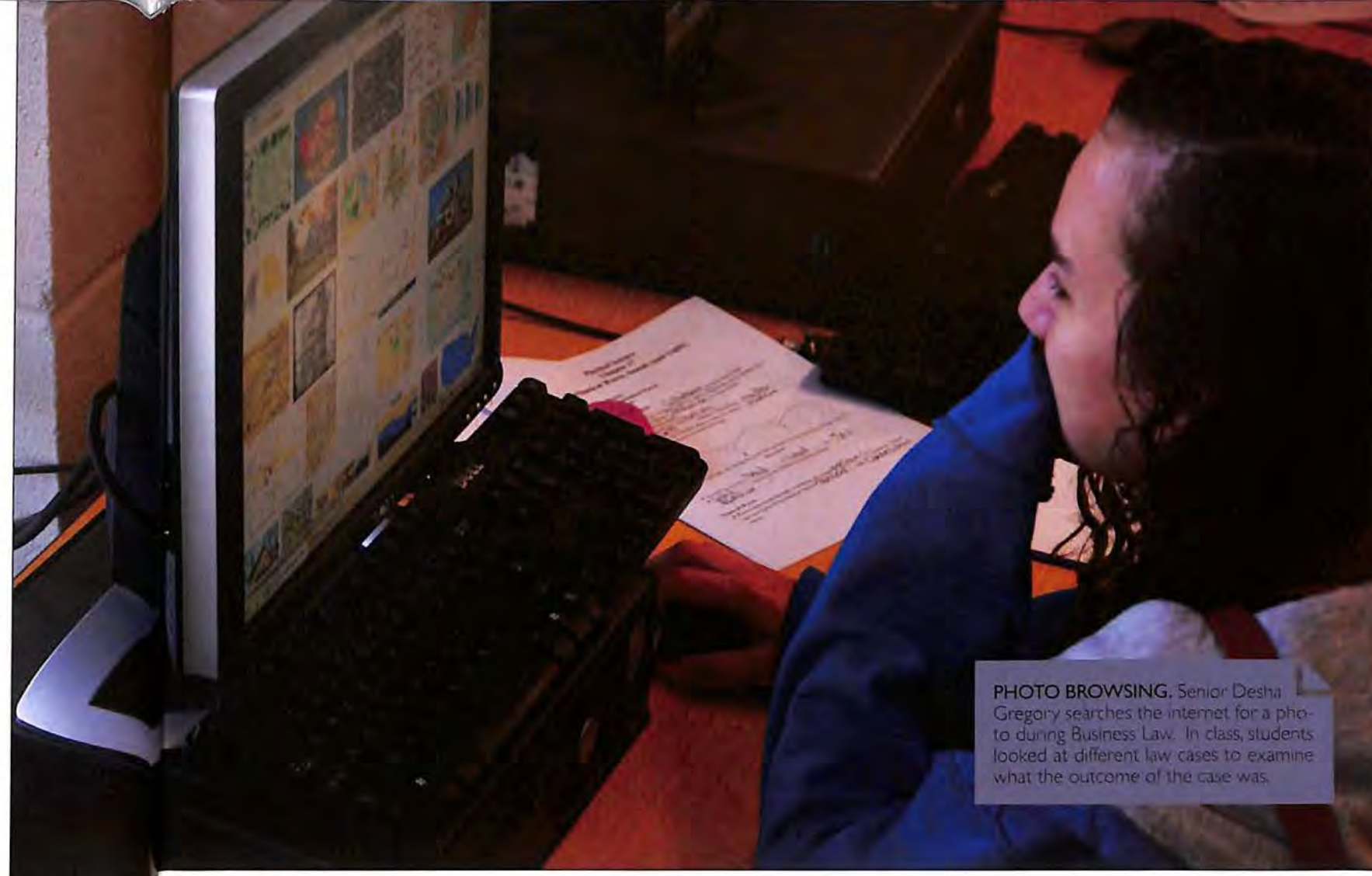

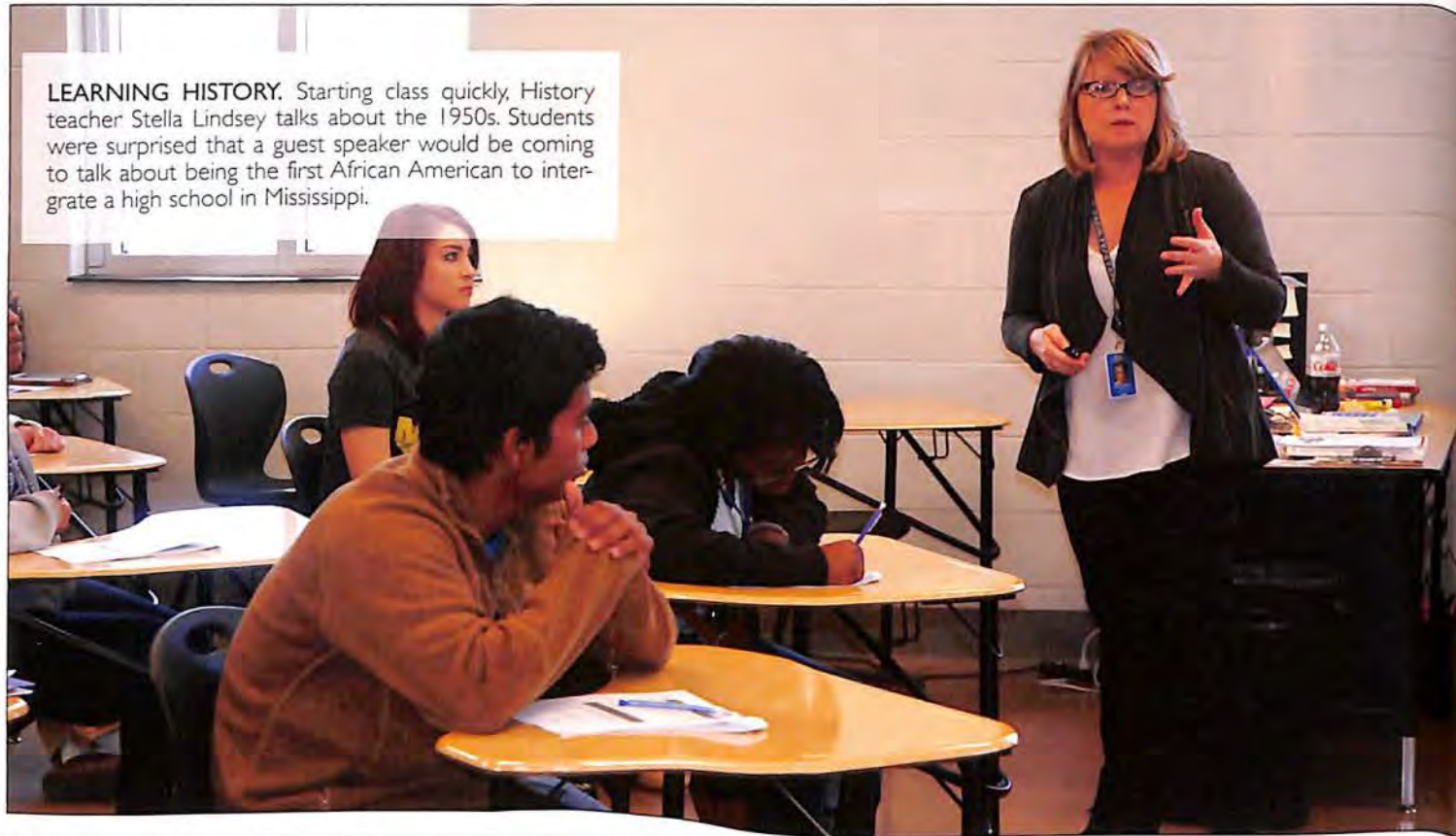

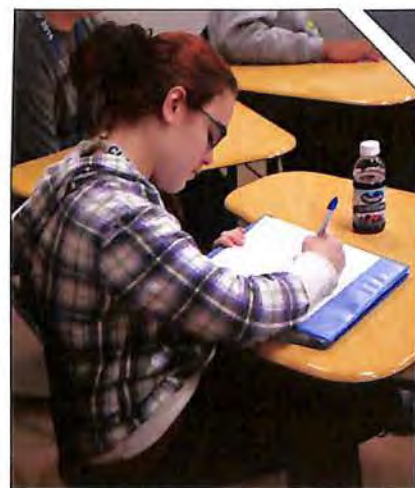

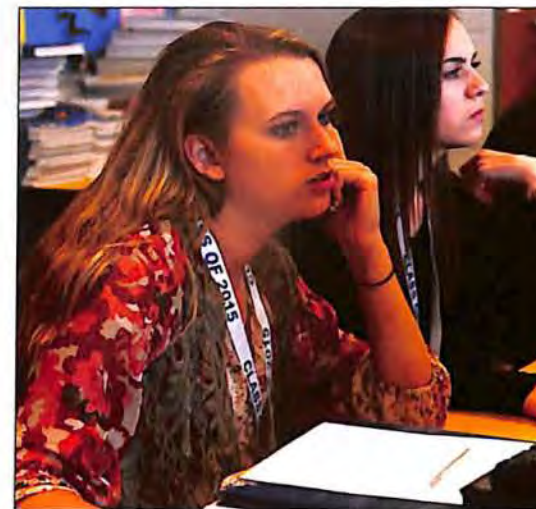

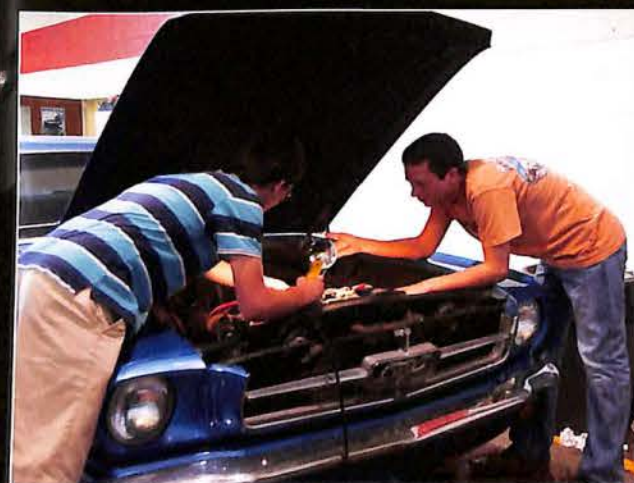

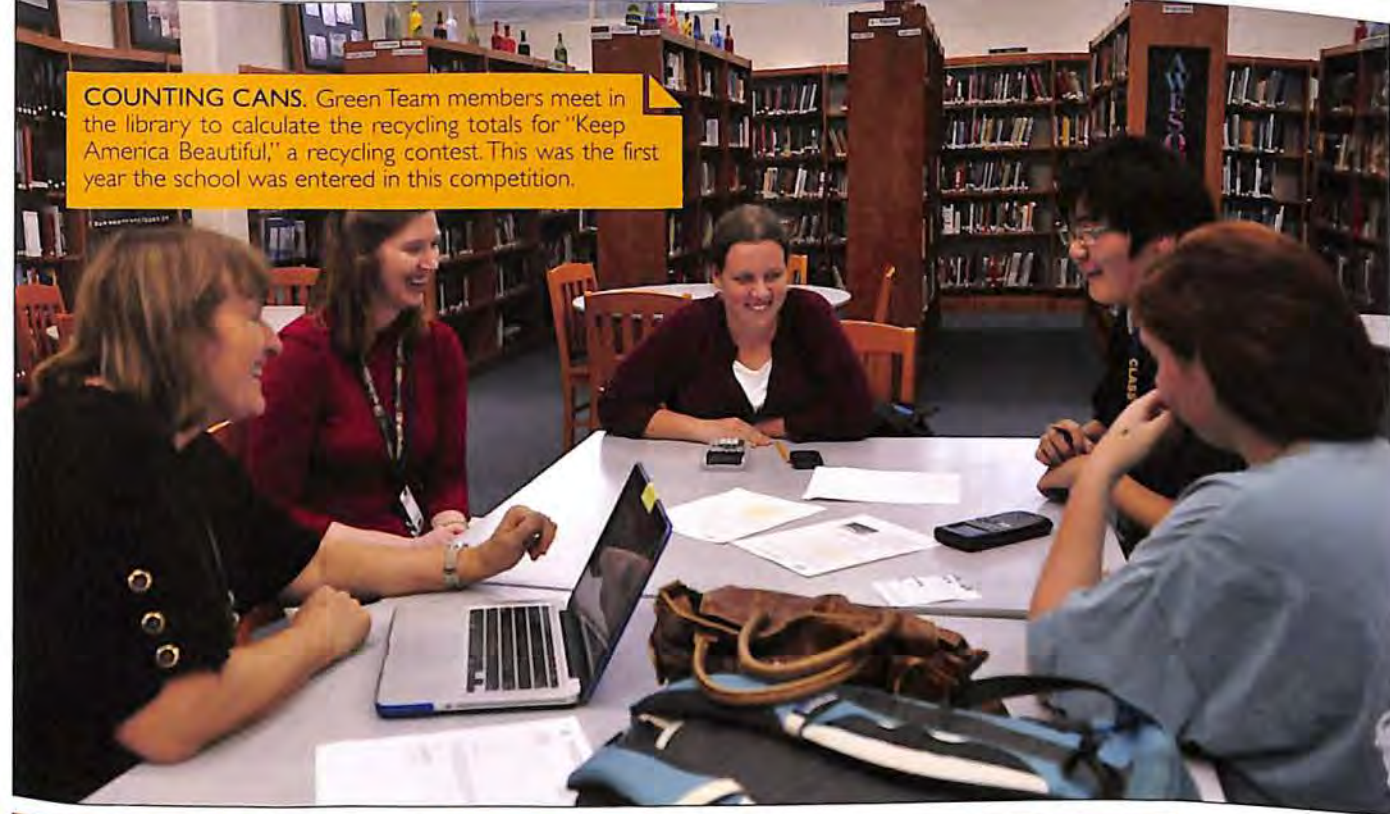

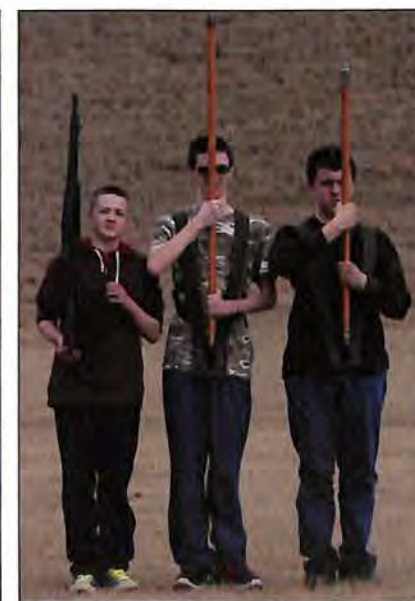

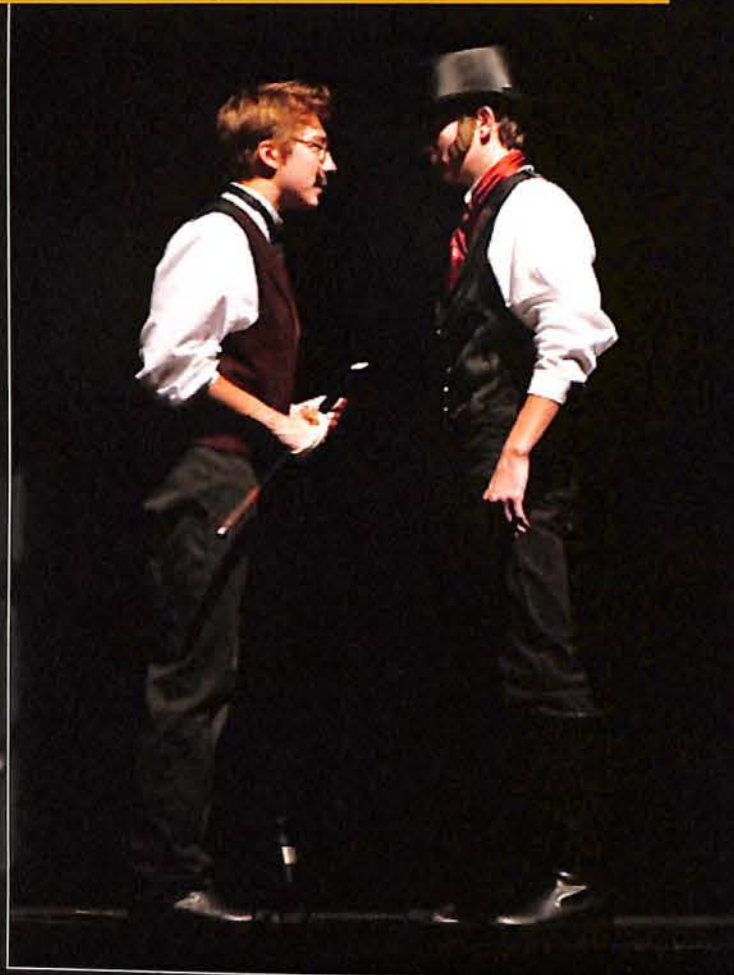

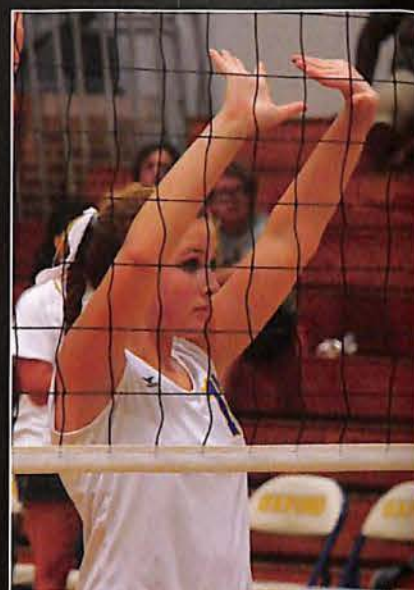

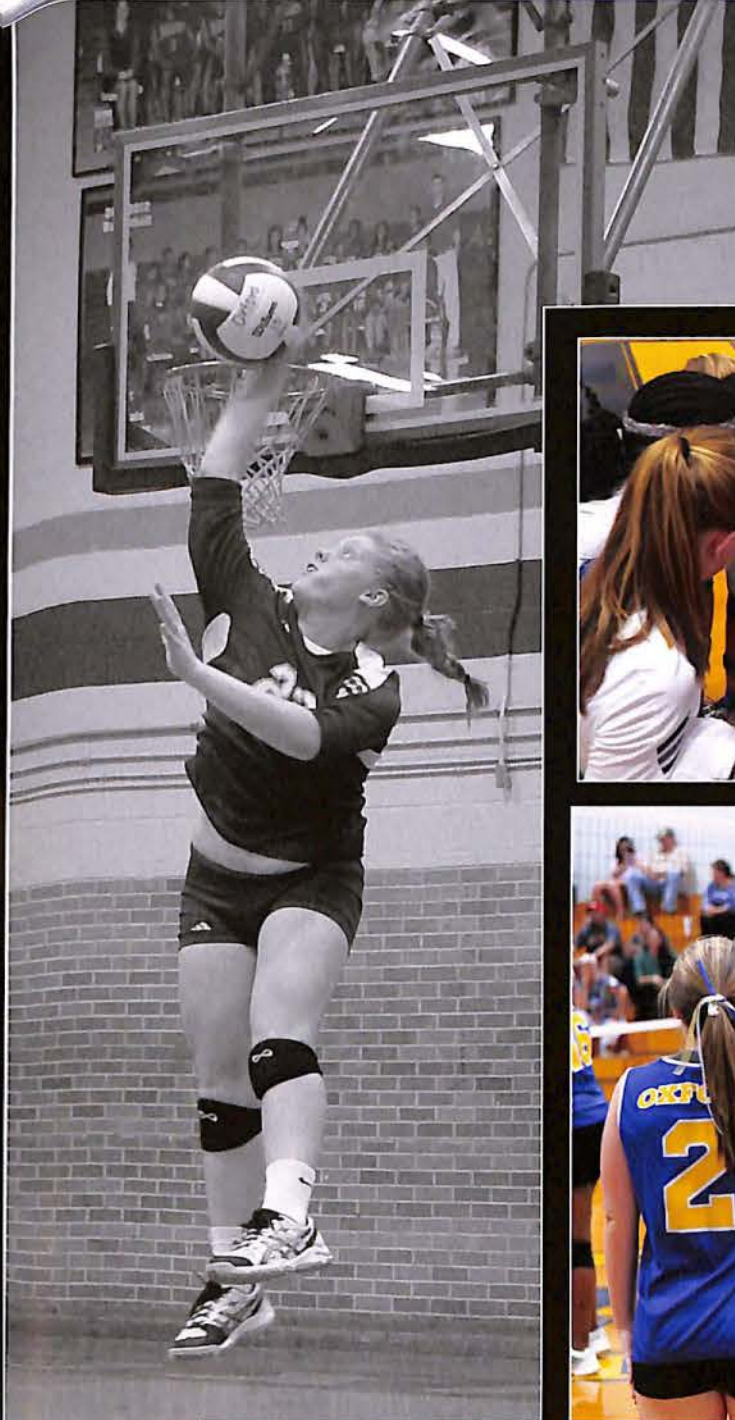

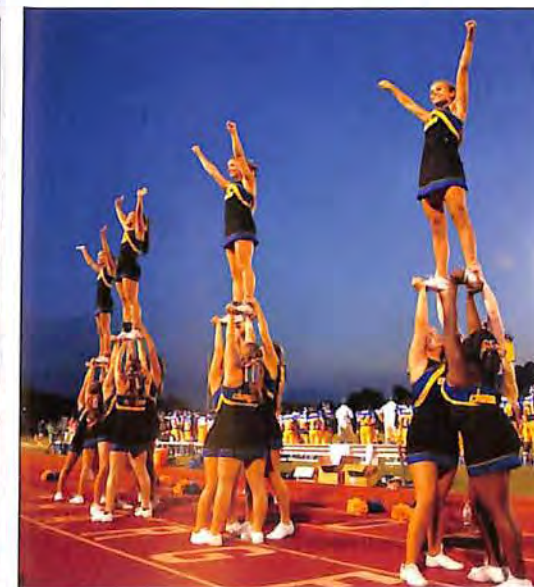

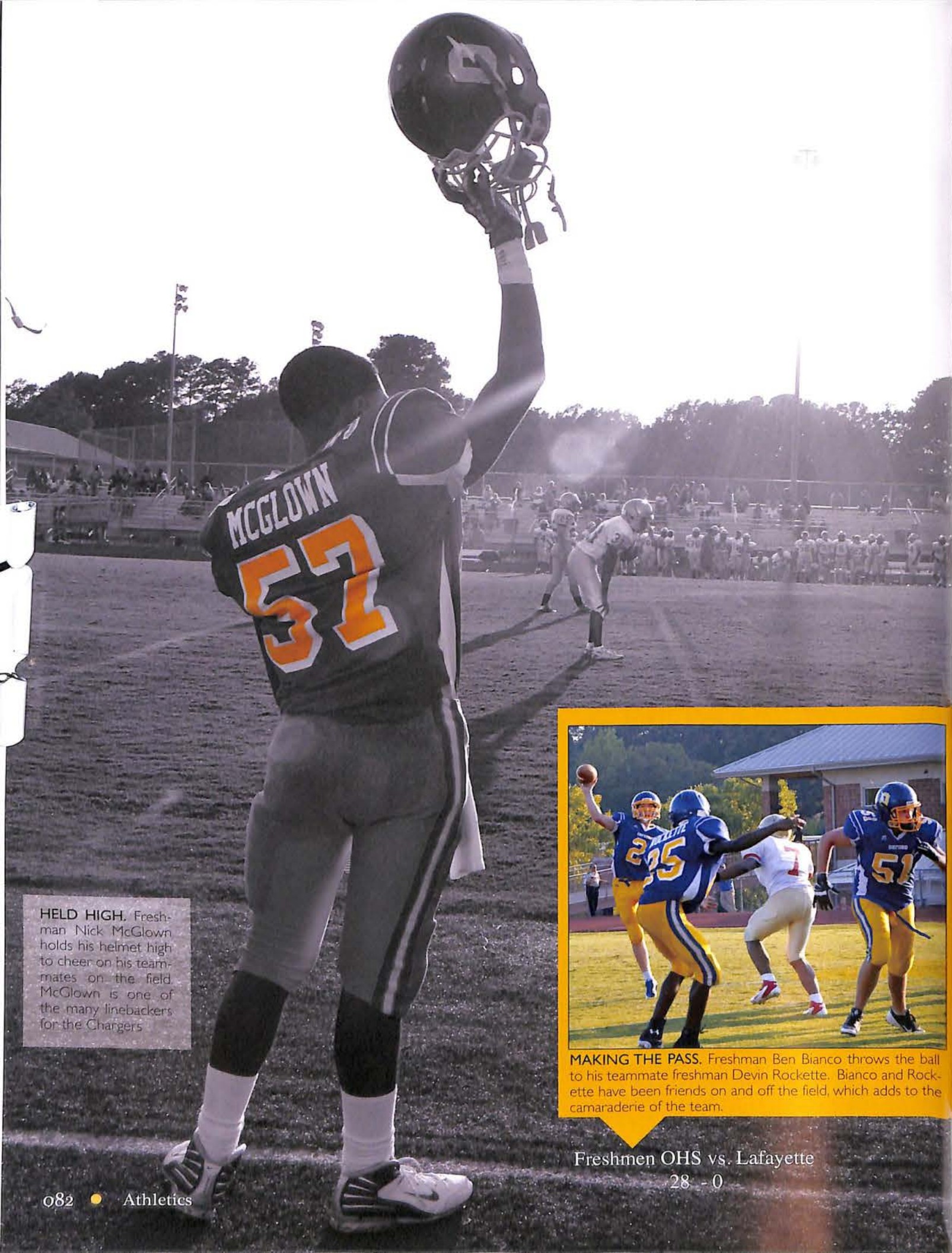

"It was our team coming together and putting our differences aside that helped us advance," he said. The team one by one picked off each opponent, advancing to the state championship.

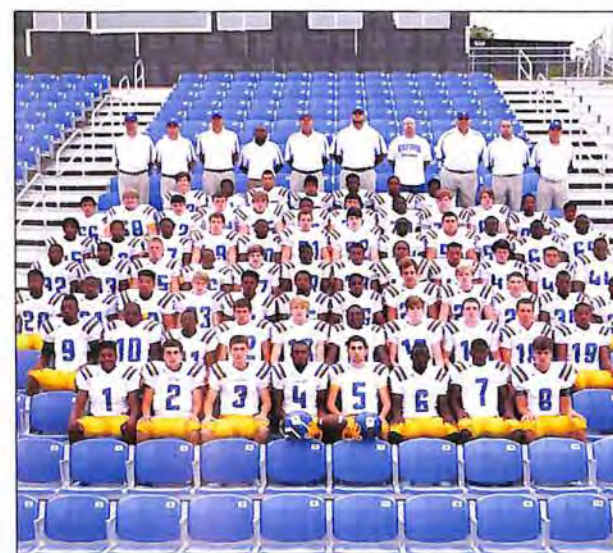

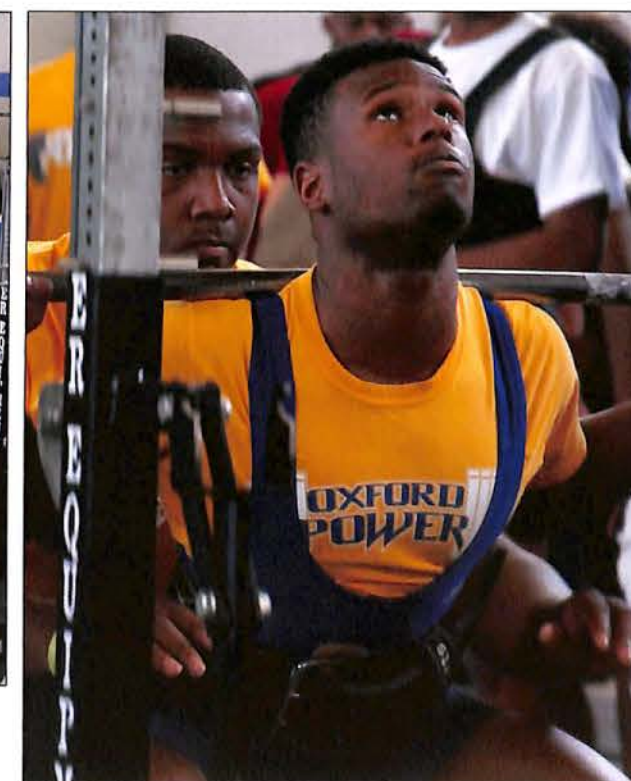

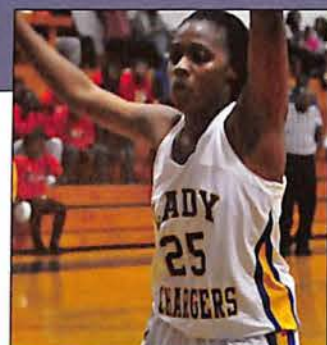

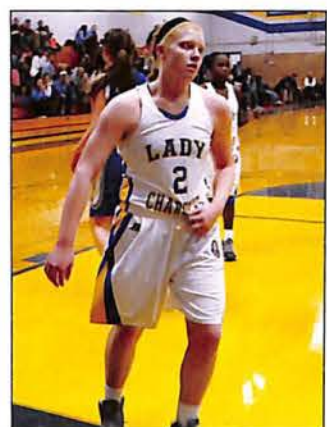

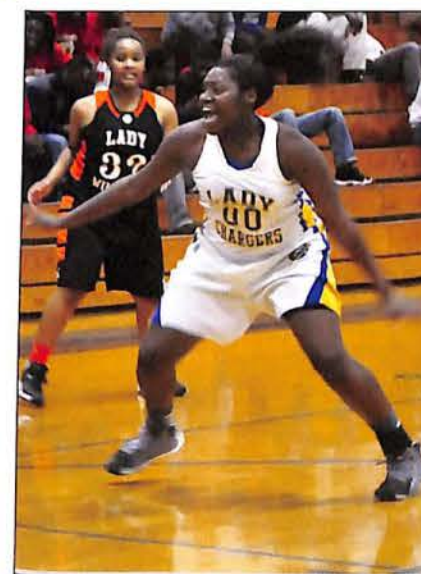

BASKETBALL COACH DISCUSSES HOW LACKING A HOME COURT AFFECTED HIS TEAM AND THEIR SEASON

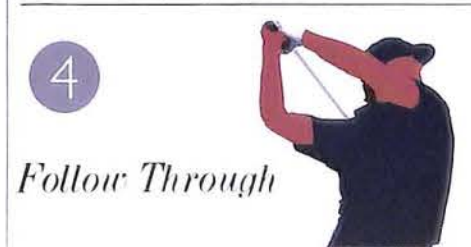

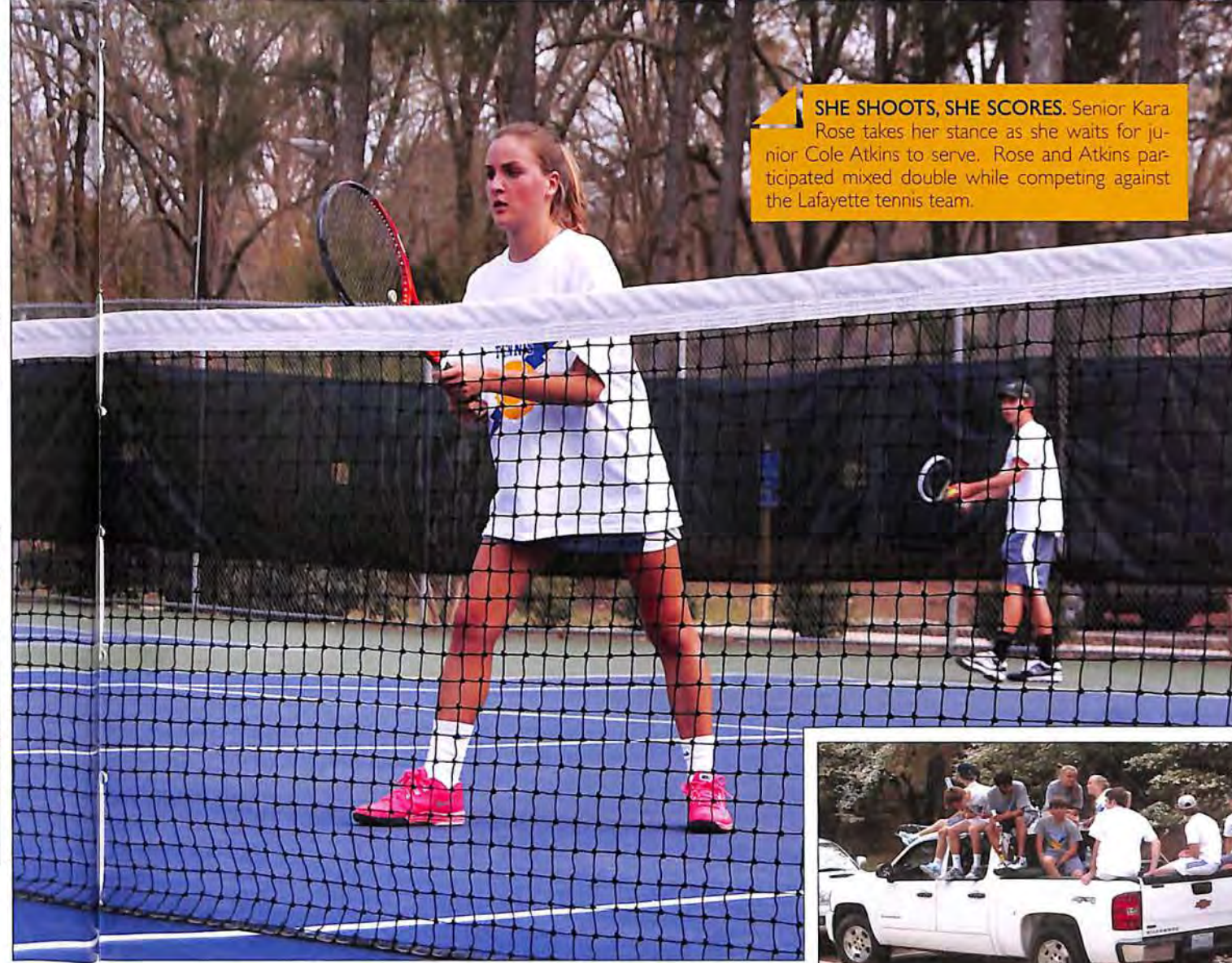

"The last seven years, I've enjoyed it," Martin said.

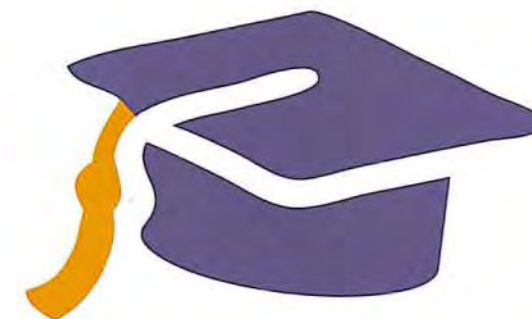
