Hello! My name is Memo Rodriguez and I am the Shawnee Mission School District Attendance Specialist for the South high school feeder area. I am here mainly to provide follow-up monitoring of students identified as needing support for chronic absenteeism, but other functions I perform are:

- I serve as a liaison between students, families, and school teams to facilitate positive student attendance.
- I cooperate with representatives from social services and law enforcement agencies in cases of mutual interests.
- I manage all associated paperwork, arrange for educational facilitators, connect families with needed community resources.
- I communicate and work effectively and cooperatively with members of the school district and community to promote student attendance.
- I work effectively with chronically absent as well as truant students and their families.
- I connect families struggling with attendance with appropriate school and community resources.

My hours at South high school are Monday through Friday 7 A.M. to 12 P.M.

Indian Woods middle school hours are Monday through Friday 12:30 P.M. to 3:30 P.M.

YOUTH TOBACCO CESSATION RESOURCES:



The My Life, My Quit Program™ is the free and confidential service for teens who want help quitting all forms of tobacco including vape. By enrolling, teens receive one on one coaching sessions with a tobacco treatment specialist trained in adolescent cognitive development. Text: "STARTMYQUIT" to 3607.



NOT for Me is a self-guided, mobile-friendly online program that leverages the American Lung Association's Not On Tobacco (N-O-T)* program to help teens break nicotine dependency, whether they vape, smoke or use other tobacco products. American Lung Association: <https://notforme.org/pre-eval>.



This is Quitting is a free mobile program from the Truth Initiative designed to help young people quit vaping. A text messaging program incorporates messages from other young people who have attempted to, or successfully quit e-cigarettes. Participants also receive evidence-based tips and strategies to quit and stay quit. Tailored based on age, between 13 and 24 years old. Text: "DITCHVAPE" to 88709.



The Kansas Tobacco Quitline: This FREE service is available to all Kansans who are ready to quit any form of tobacco or nicotine, including e-cigarettes. The Quitline is available 24 hours a day/7 days a week online or by phone. Telephone counseling is available in English, Spanish and 150 other languages. Trained Quit Coaches provide participants support to create an individual plan for quitting tobacco and fighting cravings. Adult callers may be eligible to receive a Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) Starter Kit. Youth 13 to 17 years old can access the Quitline without parental permission. Registrants work with a Quit Coach who has received specialized training on providing tobacco cessation counseling to youth. www.KSquit.org or 1-800-QUIT-NOW (784-8669) provides information and one-on-one coaching.

THE DO'S AND DON'TS

Talking to Teens About Vaping : Parent/Guardian

Hi, can we talk?

> Conversation Starters:

- "Would it be okay if we talked about vaping?"
- "Why do you think people vape?" AND "What do you think people like about vaping?"
- If providing factual information, ask, "What do you make of that?"
- For example: "Youth who vape are more likely to go on and smoke cigarettes. What do you make of that?"

Find the right moment. A natural discussion will increase the likelihood of an honest discussion. Try to ask your teen what they think about a situation you witness together such as a:

- Seeing someone use vape in person or in a movie
- Passing a vape shop while walking or driving
- Seeing a vape advertisement in a store, magazine or on the internet

> Do:



- Listen twice as much as you speak. The goal is a conversation.
- Encourage an open dialogue.
- Ask open-ended questions and reflect on those responses, make them feel heard. Be aware of the different types of vape products as they can look like common household items.

> Don't:



- Criticize or try to instill guilt.
- Turn the conversation into a lecture. (Take out the focusing on facts statement, please)
- Use scare tactics
- Try to answer questions you don't know the answer to, look the answer up together!

> At Home:



- If you smoke or vape, try quitting, it's never too late. Teens report that one of the top reasons they try e-cigarettes is that a friend or family member uses them. For free help, visit smokefree.gov or call 1-800-QUIT-NOW.
- Establish a tobacco-free home. Don't allow smoking or vaping in your home and car. Encourage avoiding all forms of products that contain nicotine.
- Steer clear of smoking and vaping in public places. Avoid restaurants, parks, and other locations that allow people to smoke or vape.

> Keep the Conversation Going



- Connect and encourage by sharing websites with facts (E-cigarettes.SurgeonGeneral.gov)
- Remind and repeat facts. Most teens do not use e-cigarettes, the nicotine can interfere with brain development, and your brain is still developing until at least age 25. You might be tempted to try the flavors, but the chemicals are also harmful to inhale into the lungs and other parts of the body.
- Share facts and resources and even relate this to yourself, a friend or family member that might be struggling with nicotine addiction.
- Ask for support from your healthcare provider, the school district or friends and family that you trust.

Personal Technology Procedures

At the January 13, 2025, Board of Education meeting, the Board approved policy JCDC: Restrictions on Possession and Use of Personal Electronic Devices. [Click here to read the SMSD policy.](#) Full implementation of this policy will begin on February 3, 2025.

This policy was developed in response to feedback and concerns raised by students, parents, and staff about how these devices can disrupt learning and negatively impact the mental and emotional health of students. Our mission, as defined in our [SMSD Strategic Plan](#), continues to be that we help each student achieve their full potential.

This fall, a Strategic Plan Action Team worked to create a policy recommendation on age-appropriate use of personal electronic devices in our schools. Their thoughtful recommendations included input from 25 Action Team members representing teachers, administrators, students, parents, and community members. Their work also included feedback gathered through a district-wide Thought Exchange, ensuring many voices and opinions were included. This process has also been informed with the advice of SMSD principals, educators of all age levels, and students and staff in the Superintendent's advisory committees. You can see more detail about this process outlined in this presentation, [linked here](#), delivered to the Board of Education at the Jan. 13, 2025 meeting.

The Shawnee Mission School District is committed to providing highly effective and consistent learning spaces across the district.

Personal Electronic Device Policy

- Personal electronic devices to include the use of cell phones and headphones (other than smartwatches) should be silenced and stored during class. Teachers may provide a secure storage option in the classroom.
- Devices can be used between classes and at lunch but must remain silenced and put away during class time unless used for learning with teacher approval.

Note: In rare cases, administration may approve exceptions.

While our schools will guide students on using personal electronic devices appropriately, we know this change will succeed with the support of our families. Thank you for your partnership in helping us maintain a positive school environment.

Tips for Students & Families

The Two-Minute Rule: Overcome Procrastination & Build Academic Success



The Two-Minute Rule is a time management technique. Here are two variations of this rule that could help a student avoid procrastination and/or start a new positive habit like studying, reading, and more.

If a task takes less than 2 minutes, do it right away!

For example...

- Write down homework in your planner
- Practice Spanish vocab in Blooket
- Finish an exit ticket at the end of class
- Email your teacher about a homework question

Have a larger task or want to start a habit but feeling overwhelmed?

Determine the first step, set a timer for 2 minutes, and get done what you can in that time.

Examples

- Need to study for a math test? Set a timer, open your notes, and complete one practice problem.
- Want to get in shape for the Spring sports season? Start with a short 2-5 minute walk.

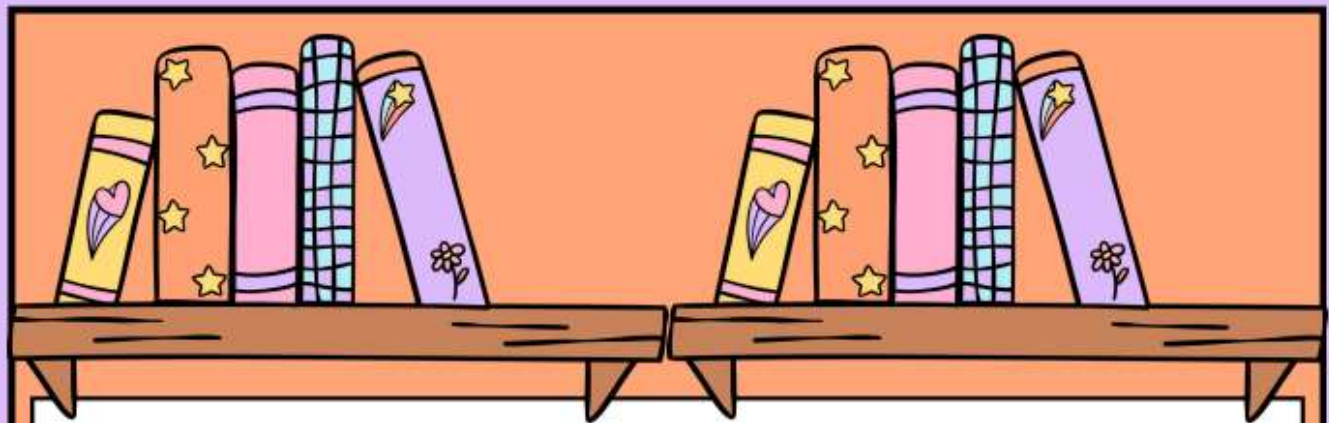
Hopefully, once you start and feel accomplished you will continue to work on the project piece by piece or for longer periods of time.
