ST. HELENS HIGH SCHOOL HEAVY EQUIPMENT STUDENTS VISIT KNIFE RIVER TRAINING CENTER



Students in Mr. Groom's *Heavy Equipment class at St. Helens High School* recently had the opportunity to visit Knife River's state-of-the-art training center in Albany, Oregon. The field trip gave students an inside look at the company's operations, career opportunities, and in-house training programs.

Knife River actively recruits and hires students directly out of high school—no prior experience required. The company offers on-the-job training and even provides support for earning a Commercial Driver's License (CDL). Entry-level positions start at \$25 an hour, with many employees earning more than \$30 an hour within their first year.

This hands-on experience offered students a real-world perspective on the high-demand, high-wage careers available in the construction and heavy equipment industries, *reinforcing the value* of the career technical education (CTE) programs offered at SHHS.

COLUMBIA RIVER MARITIME MUSEUM VISITS MCBRIDE ELEMENTARY

Students at McBride Elementary recently enjoyed a special visit from the Columbia River Maritime Museum! During the visit, students explored the significance of trees in the Pacific Northwest, focusing on the iconic Western Red Cedar.



They learned how these trees play a vital role in the region's ecosystem. The shade they provide along streams and creeks is essential for maintaining cool water temperatures, which are critical for healthy salmon spawning. Students also discovered how the Western Red Cedar's softer bark and wood make it more vulnerable to the impacts of climate change, contributing to a decline in its population in our area.



It was a hands-on and informative experience that deepened students' understanding of local environmental connections and conservation efforts.
