



SUMMER READING ASSIGNMENT

Dear Boerne ISD Middle School Students and Parents,

In Boerne ISD, students are encouraged to read for pleasure over the summer. Summer reading offers many advantages, including maintaining academic skills, fostering independent learning, and promoting a lifelong love of reading. Research shows that students who read daily develop larger vocabularies and earn better grades than those who do not.

The mission and vision of Boerne ISD are to provide students with learning opportunities that support their growth as strong readers, writers, and thinkers. We hope our students continue to grow and learn during the summer months, and for this reason, we actively promote reading throughout the summer.

Boerne ISD asks each student enrolled in an **Honors 6th–8th grade Reading Language Arts** course to read at least one book over the summer prior to returning in August. To encourage student choice and emphasize the act of reading itself, there will be no required reading list. Instead, when students return in August, they will participate in a lesson to share what they read over the summer.

Parental support in promoting literacy is especially important during the middle school years. We encourage parents to read with their students and share in their literacy journey. On the second page of this letter, you will find information about selecting books for summer reading.

SUMMER READING ASSIGNMENT

Courses:

Honors 6th, 7th, and 8th grade Reading Language Arts

Assignment:

1. Select **any book** that you have not yet read from the genre of your choice.
 - a. Your book should:
 - i. Be a hardback or paperback; not a digital ebook;
 - ii. Be appropriate for your grade level in both length (at least 150 pages) and content;
 - iii. Meet high standards for literary quality and style.
2. When class begins August 12, 2025, students will participate in activities and lessons using the book they read during the summer, so please bring the book to class.

Exceptions:

If you are a new student to Boerne ISD and cannot complete the summer reading before the first day of school, teachers will make reasonable accommodations so that you may finish the reading and complete all assignments associated with it.

Reading Tips:

- Consider joining a summer reading program at the public library.
- Share your reading with others! Some ideas are:
 - Have family reading time and talk to your family about your reading.
 - Set up a summer book club with your friends.
