What is the Accelerated Career Diploma?

- Accelerated Career Diploma (ACD) is an alternate path to a high school diploma. Students choosing this option have a career plan and want a quicker route to the credentialing needed to get to work.
- Students will complete fewer high school credits and at least one of the following: two technical certificates, one diploma, OR one associates degree in an approved skill trade area from a technical college in Georgia.
- If students are considering a 4 year college as part of their future plan, ACD is not their best option.

Traditional High School Diploma Requirements

- 4 Language Arts
- 4 Mathematics
- 4 Science
- 3 Social Studies (World History, Government, US History, Economics)
- 3 Credits of a Pathway (CTAE, World Language, Fine Arts)
- 1 Personal Fitness & Health
- 5 Elective Credits

TOTAL Credits = 24

Accelerated Career Diploma Requirements

- 2 English (must include American Lit)
- 2 Math (must include Algebra I)
- 2 Science (must include Biology I)
- 2 Social Studies
- 1 Personal Fitness & Health

TOTAL High School Credits = 9

1 of the following from an approved technical college:

- Associate Degree
- Diploma
- Two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit from approved, specific career pathways.

Why Skilled Trades?

- There are many jobs in high demand that do not require four years of college.
- Learning a skilled trade from a technical college can be a highly rewarding and well-paid option.
- Job Security. For every four people retiring from the trades, only one is stepping up to take their place.

Is the ACD Option for You?

Pros-

- Begin a focused Program of Study in as early as 10th grade.
- May be able to graduate early and begin a career.
- Tuition funded by the state.
- Obtain technical certifications required for job placement while in high school.

Cons-

- Fewer HS academic courses make it harder to attend a 4 year college later (not impossible).
- If the Accelerated Career Diploma option doesn't go well, the student may not graduate on time.
- Less flexibility of course choice (summer courses may be needed).

Who is eligible to participate?

- 9th Graders: are **not** eligible to participate in Dual Enrollment; however, students can begin requesting their HS schedule be altered to prepare for the Accelerated Career Diploma option.
- 10th Graders: May begin taking approved CTAE courses for the Accelerated Career
 Diploma option at Savannah Technical College or Ogeechee Technical College.
- 11th & 12th Graders: May begin taking any approved courses for the Accelerated Career Diploma. Beginning senior year, Accelerated Career options are very limited.
- Students must meet college entrance requirements and maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the high school and the college.

- 5. Steps 1-4 must be completed by MAY 1st!!
