Rev. Charlotte V. Greene, a native of Mobile Alabama, is a graduate of Shaw High School and Troy State University, Troy Alabama where she received her BS degree in Journalism

Upon completion of course study at Emmanuel School of the Bible in Maryland Rev. Greene pilgrimage to Israel, Greece, and Turkey.

She was the co-founder of Joshua Group Ministries in Silver Springs, Md. where she served as Worship Leader, Sunday School Teacher, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

She returned to Alabama and under the leadership of Rev. P.H. Lewis received her license to preach from Bethel A.M.E. Church in Mobile, Alabama where her Christian journey began. And after the required studies were completed, she was ordained an Itinerant Deacon and ordained Itinerant Elder in the 9<sup>th</sup> Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Reverend Greene is currently serving as Associate Pastor, bible study teacher, Worship Leader and Evangelism Coordinator, at Emanuel A.M.E Church under the leadership of Pastor John L. Dees, Jr.

In the Southwest Alabama Annual Conference of the 9<sup>th</sup> Episcopal District of the AME Church Reverend Greene served as Conference Secretary, Prayer Coordinator, and Christian Education Director and was a member of the Board of Examiners and the Nicholas Thomas Grady School of Religion. She also served as the Christian Education Director for the Mobile District

She was elected President of the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance of Mobile and Greater Vicinity and is the first female to serve in that position in over sixty years., Chair of the United Methodist Inner City Mission Board of Directors, and President of the Board of Directors for the Dora Franklin Finley African American Heritage Trail.

Reverend Greene has been a longtime supporter of the Mobile Area Education Foundation and served on the Education Commission Steering team. She is a charter board member and serves as the Secretary for Accel Day & Evening Academy Board of Directors.

She is an active member of the Pledge Group, whose mission is to shrink the racial divide between the churches and throughout the Mobile, Alabama area. This group is comprised of business leaders and clergy across different racial, denominational, and vocational backgrounds intentionally fostering relationships with those who are different.
