The goal is to enhance the skills and abilities of all parents, and other family members to provide the best possible learning environments for their child's development. ECFE parent/caregiver and child activities are led by licensed child educators, and play-based learning is emphasized.

SCHOOL READINESS PRESCHOOL CLASSES

The school readiness preschool program is a 4 Star Parent Aware rated program for children ages 3-5 and all income levels. The teachers are licensed in education and early childhood.





Parent Aware Star Rating

Star Ratings help you identify programs using research-based practices that prepare children for school and life.

Research-based High Scope curriculum, implemented in classes, teaches children to initiate, discover, experience, and learn about ideas, events, and people. Children will create, experiment, problem-solve, and resolve conflicts as they learn. This approach enhances each young person's growth in the foundations of academics as well as in social-emotional, physical, and creative areas. The development of each child is discussed with parents/guardians utilizing the Child Observation Record (COR) on-going assessment. The program includes a diverse grouping of children reflective of our community and inclusive with early childhood special education. Classes run September to May and follow the school calendar.

School Readiness classes will be held at Roosevelt and Rossman Elementary Schools starting fall 2025!

Tuition/participation fees are monthly, through arranged payments, or may be reduced or waived depending upon your financial situation. Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK), Early Learning Scholarships (ELS) and Sliding Scale may be available

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

(all children - after your child turns 3 years of age)

This health and developmental screening meets the State of Minnesota requirement for children, ages 3 to 5 years of age, and is required in order to attend Kindergarten.

Screening includes vision and hearing, height and weight, immunization review, large and small muscles, thinking, language, and communications skills, as well as social and emotional development.

Screenings for the Detroit Lakes Public Schools are provided through the Becker County Public Health Services in Detroit Lakes. This service is free of charge and takes approximately one

hour to complete.

HEARTSAVER CPR/FA/AED (16 & up)

Instructor: Mary Johnson

Heartsaver courses are intended for individuals who have a duty to respond to a cardiac emergency because of job responsibilities or regulatory requirements. This includes teachers, fitness trainers, corporate workers, restaurant employees, coaches, parents, and anyone who wants to learn how to do CPR and give first aid.

The Heartsaver CPR AED course is hands-on and covers adult, child, and infant CPR, and use of the AED (Automated External Defibrillator). Included in the course is the relief of choking. Heartsaver First Aid provides first responders with training in basic first aid procedures, including the first aid skills recommended by OSHA. This course covers first aid basics, medical emergencies, injury emergencies, and environ-
