

SHS 11th Grade Checklist

FALL SEMESTER:

- Think about jobs/ careers/ colleges that interest you:
 - Utilize the O'Net Interest Profiler to help
 - <https://www.mynextmove.org/explore/ip>
- College Search:
 - Create a Big Future account and utilize for college searching
 - Start thinking about colleges that you want to attend
 - Start thinking about if you want to go into the military
 - Attend College and Career Fairs
 - Browse the College Search website on the SHS Counseling page
- College Tours:
 - You are allowed TWO college visit days for junior year - complete the College Visit form a week in advance to excuse these days. You can get the forms from Mrs. Cebreco.
- PSAT/NMSQT:
 - This is the year when you take the Practice SAT and it will count towards the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT)
- Update your Resume:
 - Record your accomplishments, activities, and work experiences since you started high school.
- SAT/ ACT:
 - Begin studying for the SAT and/ or ACT
 - For SAT, there are lots of study materials in your CollegeBoard account
 - Look under the Testing Information & Study Materials on the SHS Counseling page for resources

SPRING SEMESTER:

- SAT or ACT:
 - Register for the SAT or ACT
 - You should take at least one test prior to the start of your senior year
 - Register at collegeboard.org or act.org
 - Stop by the counselor's office if you are on free/reduced lunch. You can use a fee waiver for the SAT test.
 - When you register for a test, you can put down the colleges where you want to attend so your scores will be sent there.
- College Search:
 - Continue researching colleges and narrow down your options
 - You can begin applying to colleges on July 1st of your senior year
- College Tours:
 - You are allowed TWO college visit days for junior year - complete the College Visit form a week in advance to excuse these days. You can get the forms from Mrs. Cebreco.
- Update your Resume:
 - Record your accomplishments, activities, and work experiences since you started high school.
- NCAA/ NAIA
 - Create an account if you are interested in being a collegiate athlete
