#### THIS YEAR, WE CELEBRATED GROUNDBREAKING ACHIEVEMENTS:



Metro Tech students excelled nationally at FCCLA, SkillsUSA, and DECA competitions. Project SEARCH students achieved a 100% employment rate, earning national recognition. Karen Upton was a finalist for National ACTE Teacher of the Year, and Metro Tech was honored as a Gold STAR School at the Oklahoma CareerTech Summit, where faculty and staff received prestigious awards.



Our partnerships grew with Metro Tech joining the OSHA Alliance Program, signing a Youth Employment Safety agreement, and opening a cosmetology classroom at Douglass High School. We launched virtual instructor-led training, Adult Basic Education and ESL classes at the American Job Center while District leadership programs prepared future leaders for success.



We also made a broader community impact with the first-ever Camp Tech Trek, reopening the Metro Tech Café, and hosting thousands for conferences and free community classes. Significant grants, including \$150,000 for opioid abatement and funds for cybersecurity and campus enhancements, demonstrated our commitment to Oklahoma City.

These accomplishments reflect the dedication of our students, faculty, staff, and community partners. Together, we continue to create opportunities, inspire innovation, and strengthen our community. ## INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENTS

#### **Construction and Facility Upgrades**

#### **Nursing Simulation Lab**

The 9,787 sq. facility allows students within Metro Tech's Health Careers programs to practice and improve their skills in a controlled environment that resembles a hospital setting. The renovations were funded through a \$2,032,767 ARPA grant.

#### South Bryant Grand Opening

Metro Tech celebrated the completion of four newly constructed training facilities: The Public Safety Academy and the Law Enforcement Training, Industrial Technology, and Automotive Technology Centers.

#### **Cosmetology at Douglass**

The 8,100 sq. ft. classroom on the Douglass High School campus contains a lab space with 20 styling stations to prepare students to become licensed cosmetologists.

#### **Aviation Campus Remodel**

The facility has been renovated for a total of \$1.8 million, including new flooring, reconstructed ceilings, interior wall painting, and remodeled restrooms.

#### Wayfinding and Signage

Installations across all campuses enhance campus navigation, making it easier for students, staff, and visitors to find their way and access resources.

#### Springlake Beautification

Metro Tech received a \$16,060 Public Space Initiative grant from the Oklahoma City Community Foundation (OCCF) to plant trees and install a student-crafted art piece on the Springlake Campus.
