



### The Big Picture with Fr. Bob



#### Dear Friends,

This past Monday, Easter Monday, I was opening the church shortly after 6:00 A.M. A parishioner was getting out of her car and said to me, "Our Holy Father has died." I will always remember where I was when I heard that news.

I am grateful that the Archdiocese gave us some guidelines on how to pray for the Pope. After both morning Masses, we prayed an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a

Glory Be. Following the 8:30 A.M. Mass, a number of people stayed and prayed a Rosary for Pope Francis.

We tolled the church bells 88 times in gratitude for the 88 years Pope Francis lovingly lived his life for the Lord and for others, especially those suffering and in need.

We draped the front doors of the church with the black banners.

We placed a picture of Pope Francis in front of St. Joseph's side altar. It was arranged beautifully and gives parishioners a particular place in the church to go and pray for Pope Francis. That simple prayer space will remain for nine days.

The Archdiocese also directed us to offer a Mass for Pope Francis as soon as possible, so we sent out a text blast to our parishioners. I thought it was an honor to be able to offer a Mass for Pope Francis on the same day that he went Home to the Lord. There were about 80 parishioners that joined Fr. John, Fr. Jeremy, Deacon Pat and myself for Mass at 7:00 P.M. Monday night.

We did all this for Pope Francis who shepherded 1.3 billion Catholics worldwide for the past 12 years.

There are a number of things I will remember about Pope Francis. Shortly after becoming Pope, he included St. Joseph's name into the Eucharistic prayers. Pope Francis established the Year of Mercy that began on December 8, 2015, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. I know that the Year of Mercy touched the lives of millions of people. He chose this 2025 Jubilee Year to have "Pilgrims of Hope" as its theme. Pope Francis said, "Through our witness, may hope spread to all those who anxiously seek it."

Pope Francis took to heart the words of Jesus, "What you did for the least of your brothers, you did it for me." (Matthew 25:40) He was always looking out with fatherly care for those who are poor and vulnerable. He was a voice for people who have no voice. He always encouraged us to compassionately accompany one another, especially through life's most challenging, painful and heart-breaking chapters.

Pope Francis was the person who promoted devotion to "Our Lady, Undoer of the Knots." I turn to Mary for help every day calling on her using this title. We all have many knots that need untying, and Mary is happy to come to our aid!

The first week after becoming Pope, there was some TV cameras filming a daily Mass he offered for Vatican employees in a small church on the Vatican grounds. When the Mass was over, the TV cameras caught him hurrying down the steps of the church. He

then turned around and greeted the people coming out of Mass. He looked just like a parish priest wanting to warmly greet his spiritual children. Pope Francis always kept the heart of a parish priest even when his "parish" grew to include 1.3 billion spiritual children!

May Pope Francis receive a beautiful and bountiful eternal reward for his loving ministry throughout his life.

*Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon him.* 

May he rest in peace.

Amen.

May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

## **Nursing Home Ministry**





### Falcons at DCHS Finding the Risen Christ in Daily Life: Praying the Examen



As we continue to celebrate the joy of Easter, we are reminded that the Resurrection is not just a historical event—it is a living reality that transforms our daily lives. One powerful way that Divine Child High School students, faculty and staff the recognize presence of the Risen

Christ is through the practice of the daily Examen of Consciousness, a prayer taught by St. Ignatius of Loyola. The school pauses each day to pray the Examen around 1:00 pm.

The Examen invites us to pause each day and reflect on where we have seen God at work in our lives. During this Easter season, as we hear stories of the disciples encountering the Risen Lord in surprising ways—on the road to Emmaus, in the breaking of bread, in the locked room—we, too, are called to notice Christ walking with us.

By praying the Examen, the DCHS Falcon community grows more aware of moments of grace, gratitude, and growth. We ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate our day, we give thanks, we review our experiences, we seek forgiveness, and we look forward with hope. In this sacred reflection, we begin to see how resurrection is unfolding within and around us—often in the smallest, quietest ways.

This Easter, may the Examen help us to live as resurrection people—attentive, grateful, and ever

more aware of the God who brings life out of death and light out of darkness.

### **Baptisms**

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a Baptism class prior to the Baptism. The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

### <u>Marriages</u>

One person of the couple must be an active, registered parishioner of Divine Child for at least 6 months. (Exceptions are made for DC alumni.) The Church requires a minimum of 6 months for marriage preparation. Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a Divine Child priest. All weddings will take place at Divine Child Parish and the celebrant will be one of our priests.

### **Funerals**




