Some Juniors and Seniors with disabilities are enrolled in ITEC (Individualized Transition Education to Careers). Students receive job coaching in a career field they are interested in while continuing to take classes at their home school.

The district supports students' social-emotional health through the following:

- SWL elementary and secondary social workers provide support for students and families by connecting them with community wraparound services to support the whole child.
- Partnerships with three community counseling agencies to provide oneon-one direct support to students during the school day.
- School Counselors in every school.
- Districtwide Behavioral Specialist support.
- School Resource Officer
- Trained Therapy Dogs

TEACHING AND LEARNING

Our vision for student learning is to challenge every student to expand their mindset and consider new opportunities and ideas while maximizing their individual potential.

Watkins Memorial High School and Watkins Middle School

- Rigorous coursework designed to meet the full range of student needs, including a wide variety of electives
 - CCP courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Computer Science, and Art
 - AP courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Spanish, and Computer Science
 - Grades 9 12 Entrepreneurship, and Computer Science pathways
 - Grades 6 12 Band, Choir, Orchestra, Visual Art, and Theatre
- Thriving agriculture program in grades 6 12, including a food forest that supplies cafeterias with produce, chicken and rabbit breeding, and hydroponic propagation

Elementary and Intermediate Schools

- Structured literacy practices aligned with the Science of Reading
- Over 20 teachers at various levels of Orton-Gillingham training
- Primary literacy specialists in every building
- Bridges Mathematics supports inquiry and problem solving

Connection Club and Peer Collaboration

 In all grades, students with disabilities work and learn alongside peers. In K-5 Connection Club, students strive to develop relationships, social skills, and as the name implies, connections. Peer Collaborators in 6-12 not only work with peers in their buildings but also work in other buildings across the District.

Beyond the classroom, we offer a vibrant array of extracurricular activities designed to ignite passions and broaden horizons. From athletics and arts to clubs and community service, there's something for all students to explore.




- Robotics in grades 4 12, building skills including:
 - mechanical and electrical engineering and design
 - programming and software development
 - CAD and modeling
 - project management and strategy

- Annual K-12 District Arts Festival
 - o over 3,000 visitors tour the gallery annually
 - o over 1,800 pieces of artwork displayed
 - band, orchestra, and choral concerts by students at all grade levels
 - student created ceramics are the highlight of the Empty Bowls initiative, benefitting Licking County LEADS



- ECO Warriors
 - student-led group won a grant and raised over \$9,000 in community donations to support the planting of 75 trees on the WMHS campus, collaborating with architecture consultants on project design



- 22 school-sponsored varsity sports as members of the Licking Country League
- 16 different sports have won an LCL team championship since 2020 (16 out of 17 sports eligible)
- The Lady Warrior Softball program has won four straight LCL, District, and Regional Championships (2021-24)
- 4 straight D-I State Final 4 appearances (D-I Softball State Runners-Up in 2022 and 2024)
- 2023 OHSAA D-I Individual Track & Field State Champion - Victoria Harvey (Pole Vault)
