Why is the sense of community important?

1. Belonging and Support

 College can be overwhelming—new environment, academic pressure, being away from home. A strong sense of community helps students feel like they belong, which can ease loneliness and reduce stress. It's comforting to know there are people who "get" what you're going through.

2. Academic Success

• When students feel connected, they're more likely to engage in class, collaborate with peers, and seek help when needed. That kind of environment can boost motivation improve grades, and even increase graduation rates.
