He is not dead,—the lad of our affection,— But gone unto that school Where he no longer needs our poor protection, And Christ himself doth rule.



GIRLS' LEAGUE


The Girls' League organization has carried out its aim of training girls to become better citizens during war emergencies with talks by professional people, skits, and illustrative lectures.

This year's football team, which pulled more thrilling victories out of the bag and suffered the most heartbreaking setback in the history of the North Cache teams, ended this season with a well earned second place in the Region.

The 1942 football team, was a highly potential grid machine combining speed, hard blocking and tackling—a combination hard to beat. Material was good and plentiful. At ends were Porter, Lott, Poulsen; linemen were Waddoups, Buxton, Ransom, Kobayashi, Pond, Karren, Hyer, Lambros, and Van Orden; versatile Rich, Hyden, Roylance, Jones, and Albiston in the backfield.

In the pre-regional practice game, with Preston the Bulldogs scalped the Indians, 14-7, rolling up fourteen first downs to two for Preston.

Completely upsetting the pre-game dope bucket, the amazing Bulldogs rallied magnificently after Box Elder had scored first, to register their first regional victory, 13-6.





Playing one of their best games of the season, the Bulldogs chalked up their second regional win as they defeated Logan in a traditionally bloody duel and added Captain Rich's sweater in the trophy case.

Then came the beet vacation during which time North Cache was scheduled to play Bear River; but, Bear River, minus their coach was forced to forfeit, I-O.

Terribly ragged, the Bulldogs stumbled through the Weber game, after three weeks of beet topping, barely eeking out a scoreless tie. Only Bulldog grit and determination stalemated the determined Warrior.

Shifting into high gear again, the maroon and white team hit on all eleven to vanquish the South Cache Spartans, 14-0, and climbebd another step in the ladder leading to the Regional crown.







Under the competent leadership of Coach Whitman and Captain Burke Rich, the North Cache Bulldogs finished a successful season as runner-up for the Region One championship.


