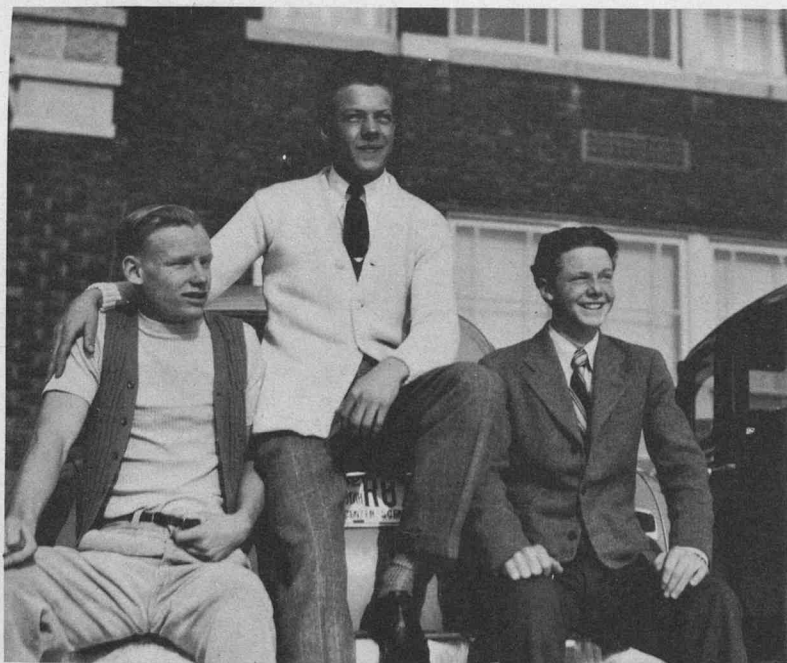
OUR SEMINARY

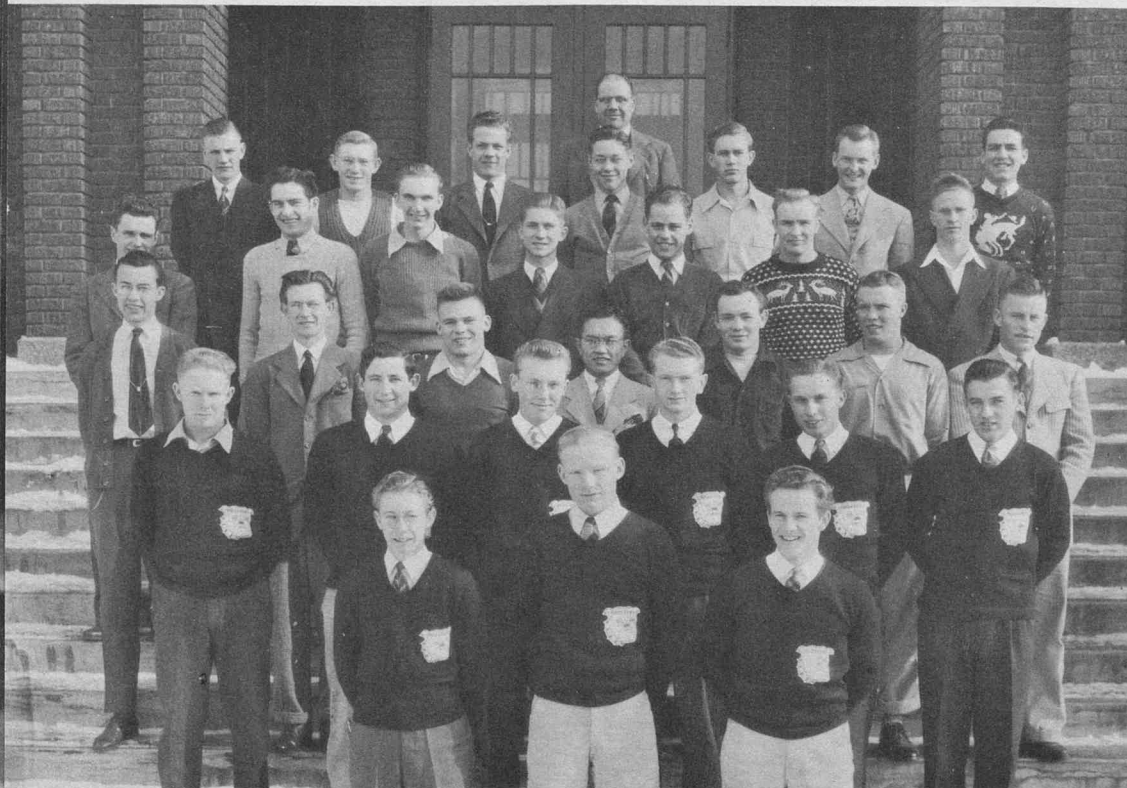

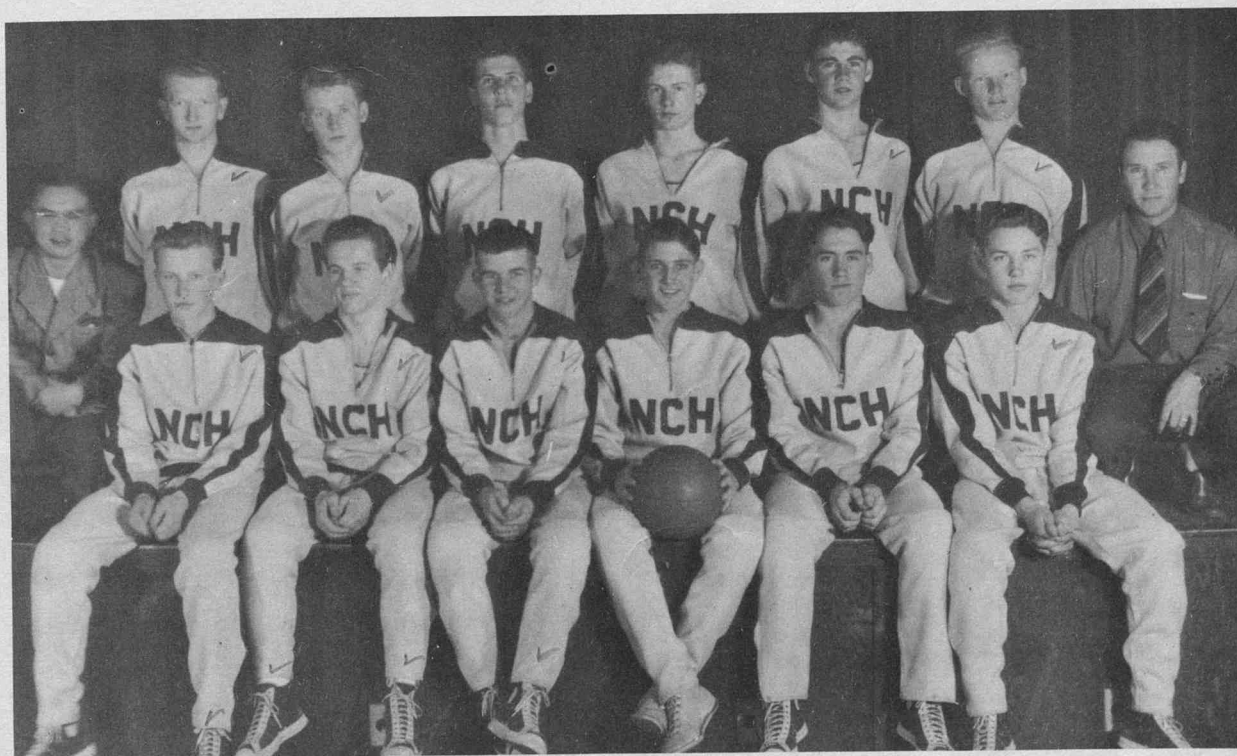
PLANT MEDAL
