


DEDICATION



The seniors "time on the air" showed exceptional leadership, and with an enthusiastic class, ready always to do their part, upheld the traditional Bulldog spirit.


The activities of this energetic group included an outstanding assembly, a very successful senior party, a gift to the school, and lastly graduation.
