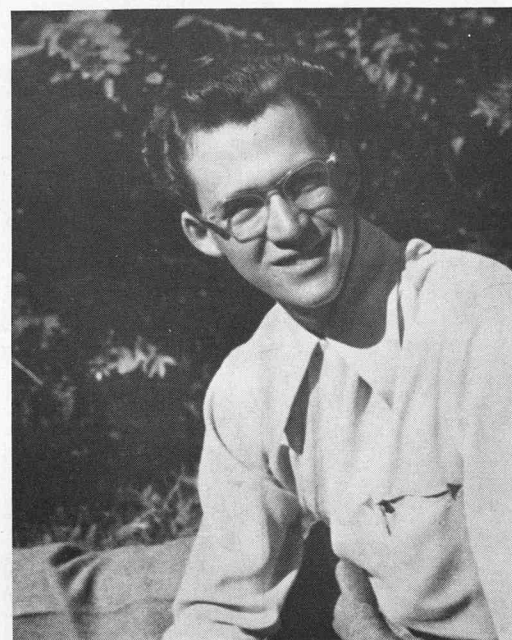
Student Body Officers

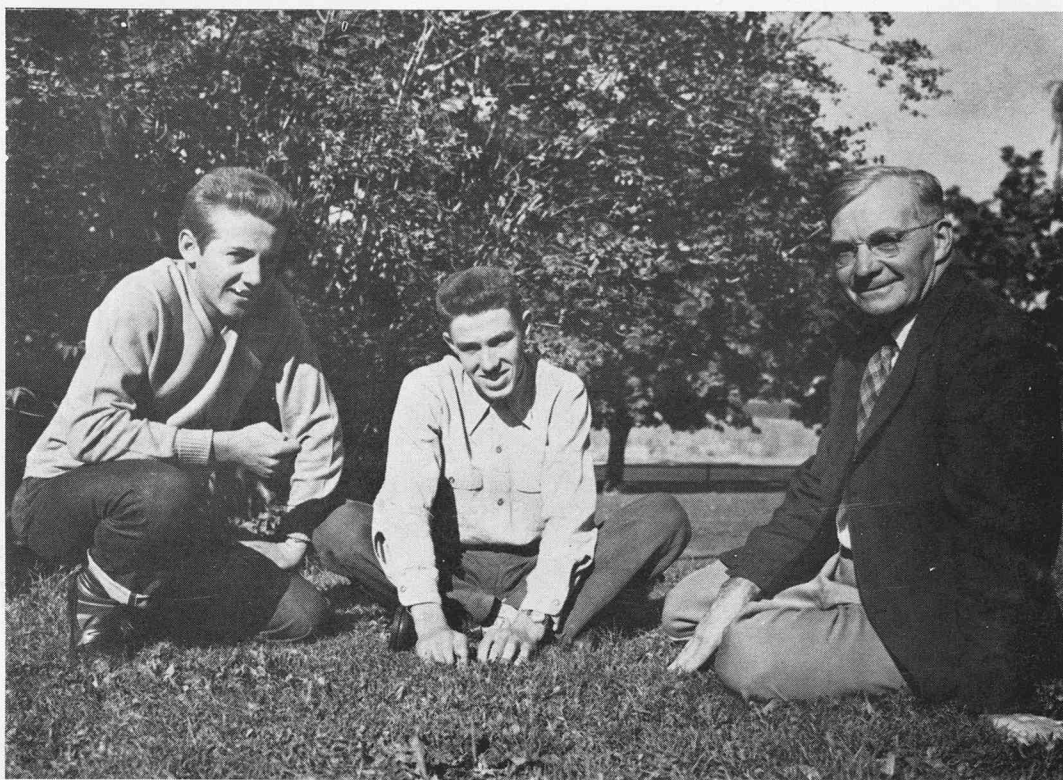


MARJORIE REESE*Secretary*

Development in the musical arts is present for those desiring such. Mechanical and industrial arts are also taught in the modern shop.

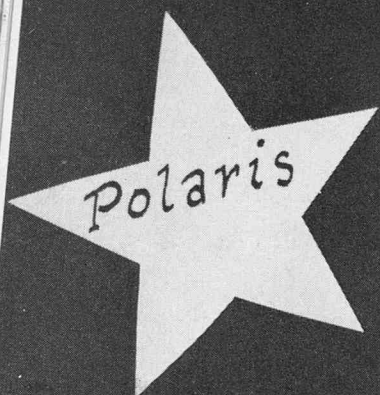
Many fine athletes are produced as a result of proper gymnasium equipment, physical education, and training.

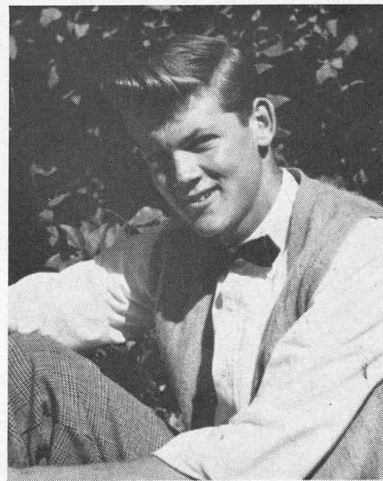

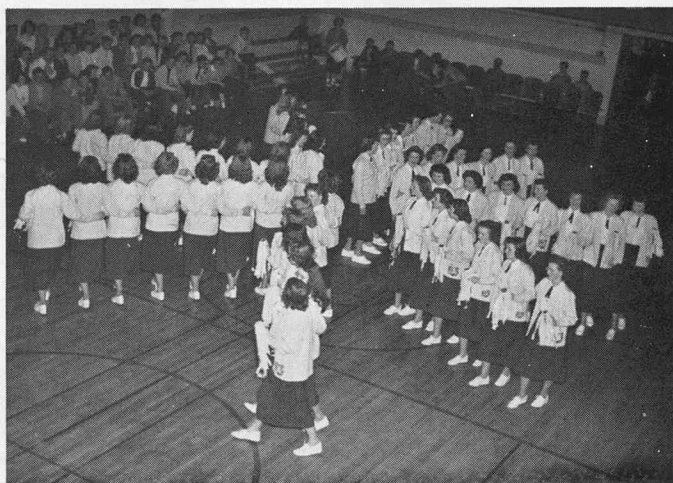

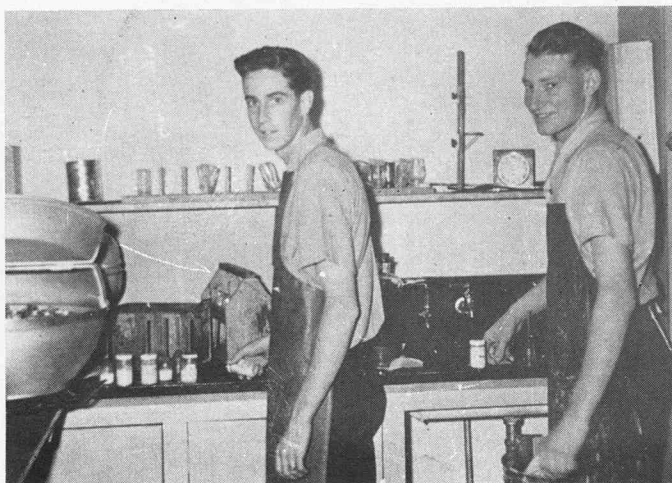

of membership are contingent upon definite accomplishments in connection with the vocational agriculture programs.

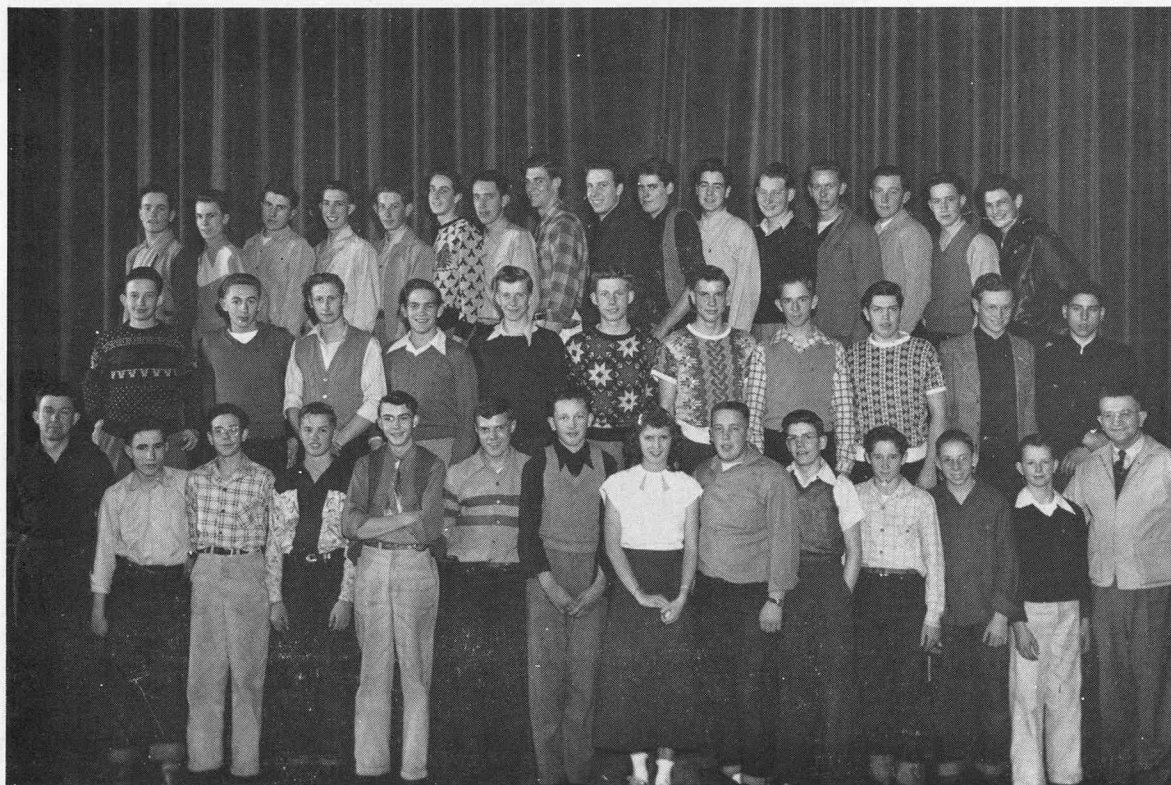

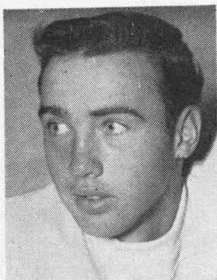


Plant Medal

The awards this year were presented to Monte Merrill and Eunice Tidwell. Their names will be engraved on a plaque which was awarded by the Kiwanis Club.

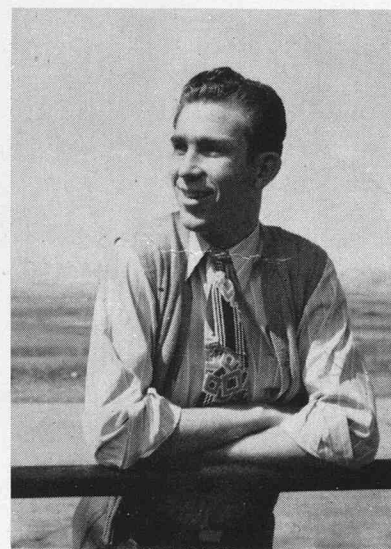
