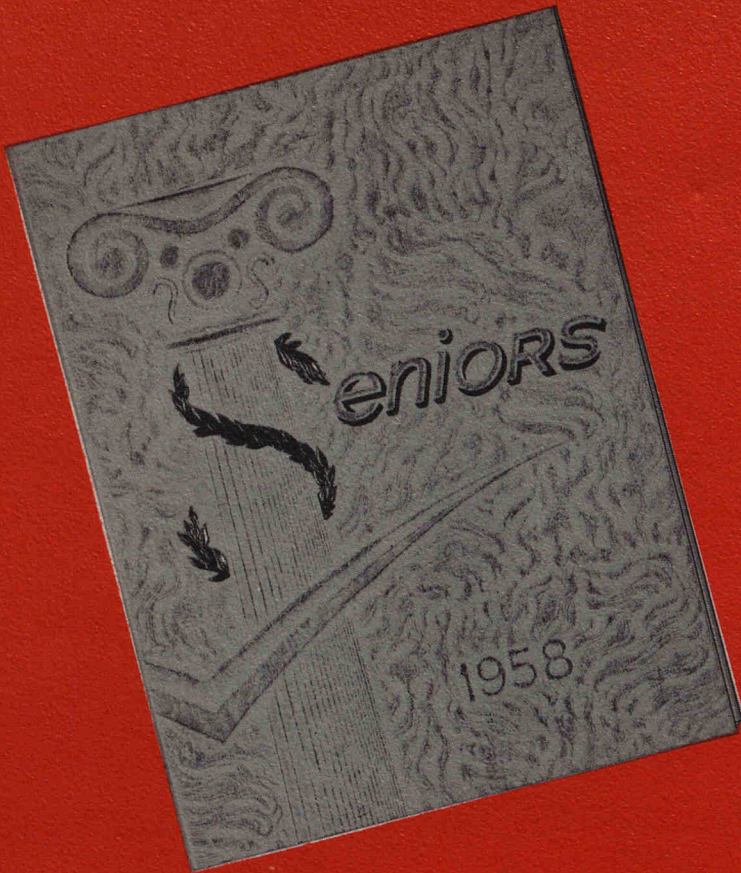
## Homeroom Officers

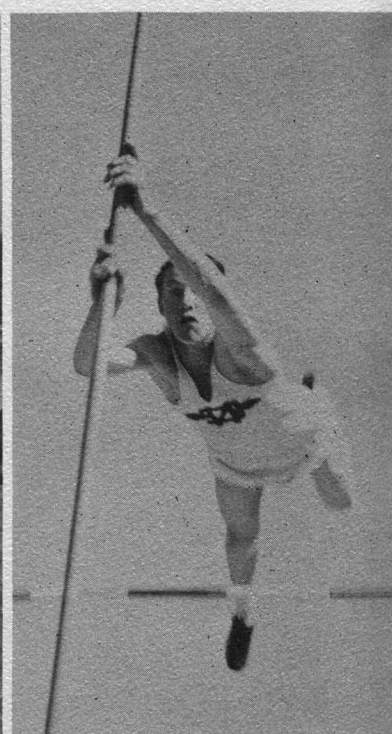
PARSON AWARD

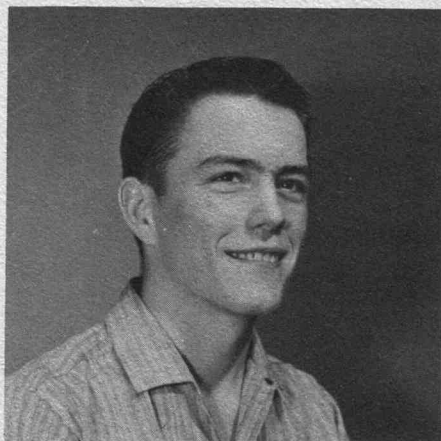


## Awards
