More than a quarter of a century has passed since North Cache High School was transformed from a dream in the minds of progressive men to a tangible reality.

North Cache is no longer in its infancy, nor is it completely mature. But the metamorphosis it has undergone during its 38 years of existence has given it prestige and recognition among other high schools.

After a lengthy debate over where the school was to be built, the present site was agreed upon; and the building was erected in 1921. C. H. Anderson was the first principal. As the school grew larger, a need arose for a wider variety of subjects, so in 1929 a shop was built. J. W. Kirkbride was principal at this time. When Principal Kirkbride was appointed superintendent, C. I. Stoddard became the third principal. In 1950 Principal Stoddard retired, and Robert Dahle took over as principal of North Cache.

In 1952 the lighted N. C. was added to our building, which at night serves as a beacon light to the residents of the valley. And now in 1958 the white N. C. letters have been firmly planted on the hill, where in daytime our symbol is a constant reminder of all that North Cache stands

On Friday, May 16, 1957, a dream of Northcachians for many years became a reality. An "NC" made of cinder blocks was installed on a hill overlooking the school.

The "NC" was a gift from the graduating class who donned work clothes and installed the letters themselves. We are indebted to those seniors for a lasting gift that is there to constantly remind us of our beloved North Cache.
