Accessing BH Services through Northshore School District

Elementary School

- All elementary schools have access to a mental health specialist at least one day a week. Mental health specialist referrals must initially go through the school counselor.

Middle School

- Counselors and administrators collaborate to identify students who may benefit from mental health support during the school day. With support from the SBIRT grant, NSD conducts mental health screenings for at least one grade level per middle school to identify students who may benefit from in-school or external resources. <https://www.nsd.org/our-district/who-we-are/mental-health/sbirt>

High School

- All high schools have a mental health specialist assigned to each location. Mental Health specialist referrals must initially go through the school counselor.

King County Client Services Line

Provides Substance Use Disorder & Mental Health inpatient and outpatient service recommendations based on location and age.

Primarily for Medicaid families. Anyone can call.

Line open 8am-5pm Mon-Fri. Leave voicemail if needed and should get call back within 24 hours.

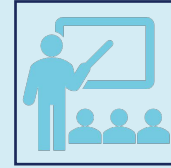

Kids' Mental Health King County (KMHKC)



Provides care coordination and resource navigation to school-aged children/youth in King County, regardless of insurance type. Anyone can refer.



Will soon be providing Multidisciplinary Team Meetings for children/youth with complex behavioral health needs, such as those being boarded in emergency departments or non-treatment facilities.

Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe)/MIDD Wraparound



Provides team-based planning process to children/youth experience complex needs at home and in community.



WISe is available for qualifying Medicaid insured children/youth. MIDD Wraparound is available for qualifying children/youth with private or no insurance.
