I. Call to Order

VI. CAC Presentation: Best Practices for Students/Staff Utilizing Temporary Instructional Spaces

Study team members Joe Brinkman (chair), Sandy Zuefle, Erinn Hunley, Amanda Pyzoha, Sven Schreiber, Stephanie Denton and Emily Burton presented their findings on Best Practices for Temporary Instructional Spaces. The team conducted surveys and interviews, engaged with architects, school planners and logistical experts, evaluated key logistical components, assessed technology, storage and classroom layouts and used this collected data and insights to formulate actionable recommendations for the District.

VII. Committee Reports

Belonging and Inclusion Collaborative – Mr. Weber reported that the committee met on March 18th where Amy Webb led a discussion on disability inclusion.

Citizens Advisory Committee – Mrs. Zoller reported that the next report will occur at the April 21st meeting with the final study team presenting their work: Social Media and Its Impact on Students and Families.

District Leadership Team / Student Achievement – Mr. Weber reported that the DLT met on March 20th to review 25-26 preliminary goals aligned with the pillars of the strategic plan, the 26-27 district calendar, and best practices for communicating academic progress to families in interim reporting.

Facilities Committee – Mr. Weber reported that the Presbyterian Church of Wyoming expressed interest in supporting Elm students in temporary instructional space during Elm construction. Mr. Weber and Mrs. Johnson also reported on the successful sale of the bonds on March 13th with closing scheduled for April 3rd. A CORE team update was also shared which included revisions to the Hilltop design in response to feedback from the design community workshop.

Finance Committee – Mrs. Johnson reported that the committee met earlier in the evening and reviewed the salary and benefit analytic and primary facilities financing. With regard to primary facilities financing, the committee reviewed the bond sale data against the millage model. The committee also discussed the state biennium budget and legislative proposals related to state funding for public schools, including the schedule for proposals forthcoming from the Ohio House of Representatives and the Ohio Senate.


