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# ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

The Education Foundation originated in the 1980's by education-friendly pioneers Dick Elkins and Frank Roszell. Mr. Elkins formed the 501c3 through the Saginaw Chamber of Commerce. Their one fundraiser, a golf tournament, would provide resources for area businesses and scholarships for graduating seniors.



In 2005 then Superintendent, Weldon Hafley, negotiated with the chamber in order to form the education foundation exclusively with the district to support EMS teachers and students. The chamber gifted their 501c3 to the district and it was named the Eagle Mountain Saginaw ISD Education Foundation. Today the foundation serves over 21,000 students and nearly 4,000 employees through scholarship and grant programs. However, since 2019 with the addition to community partnerships the foundation has lead community-wide initiatives through organizing cooperating businesses, and community leaders in an effort to strengthen relationships and build upon district priorities.

The Foundation offers scholarships to students and employees. It also funds teaching grants which must be innovative and stimulate student learning and creativity by enhancing the existing curriculum.


