

# SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE

On behalf of the School District of Ashland, I would like to thank all of our citizens for getting out to vote on April 1st. The operating referendum question passed by a vote of 2828 for and 2522 against. The vote will be canvassed on April 7th and officially recorded by our Board on April 21st.

The Board of Education, staff, families, and citizens worked hard to communicate across the entire community. We will be continuing with that community engagement regularly as we set the budget for the next school year. These are still uncertain times, and we need to continue to navigate state and federal questions about school funding.

We will continue to strive to provide the best education and community service with this new investment in resources. The process of community dialogue has brought us not just more funding resources but also a new level of commitment to our community involving our owners, our citizens.

# **Are We Making Progress?**

Success in education is measured in many ways, but benchmark testing is one of the most widely used metrics. These assessments, given in the fall, winter, and spring, evaluate student performance in Math and Reading and track growth over time. While they provide only a snapshot of a student's abilities on a given day, they are generally reliable indicators of overall class and grade-level progress.

So, how are we doing? I analyzed four years of our STAR assessment growth data to find out.

This example data set tracks our current 10th graders' math performance over the past four years. The results show steady improvement: more students are reaching proficiency (green), fewer need extra support (yellow), and the number requiring urgent intervention (red) is shrinking. This is positive growth. I reviewed all of our STAR data and below are the results.

#### Performance Trends Across Grade Levels

#### LSE/MVS (Grades 3-5):

- Reading: 52-55% (LSE) and 65-73% (MVS) of students are proficient, with variable growth over time.
- Math: 48-56% (LSE) and 74-94% (MVS) of students are proficient, with variable growth.

#### AMS (Grades 6-8):

- Reading: 53-64% of students are proficient, with good growth over time.
- Math: 41-55% of students are proficient, with static or variable growth.

#### **AHS (Grades 9-10):**

- Reading: 60-67% of students are proficient, with good growth over time.
- Math: 50-57% of students are proficient, with good growth over time.

#### **Key Takeaways**

A clear trend emerges: proficiency increases as students progress through grades, and fewer students remain in the red. This suggests that while students enter our district with a wide range of skills—common in lower-income communities like ours—they tend to catch up over time.

Notably, recent years have seen greater gains. Our focus on targeted interventions, rigorous instruction, and teacher teams collaborating around student success is paying off. We've shifted from a "teach it and move on" approach to a "how do we support those who didn't get it the first time" mindset.

We still have room to grow, but we're on the right path.

# <u> DISTRICT HEALTH SERVICES - FAMILY FAQ</u>

### What is the protocol if my child has pinworms?

There are no exclusion criteria for children diagnosed with pinworms - this means they may stay in school. Teach your child to refrain from scratching their bottom and have them wash their hands often - especially after using the bathroom and before meals.

#### What is the protocol for Hand-foot-and-mouth Disease?

There is no exclusion criteria for students with Hand-foot-and-mouth Disease unless they have a fever or cannot maintain hygiene and avoid close contacts with others. For younger students (K4 and KG), they may struggle with avoiding close contact with others, keeping their fingers out of their mouth/nose, etc, so they may need to go home until symptoms improve.
