BAPTIST'S BLACK MEN IN WHITE COATS SCHOLARSHIP

Application Deadline: March 19, 2021

Amount: \$1,000 per recipient

A total of six scholarships will be awarded.

The mission of Black Men in White Coats is to increase the number of Black men in the field of medicine through exposure, inspiration and mentoring. Baptist Memorial Health Care is accepting applications for scholarships from high school, college and postgraduate students interested in pursuing health care careers. To participate, applicants must be registered to attend the BMIWC summit and submit a 3–5-minute video that includes the following information:

- Tell us about yourself: name, major, school, interests, etc.
- What are your academic and/or career goals?
- Share how the *Black Men in White Coats* movie has enhanced your desire to pursue a health care career.
- Share how a health care professional has influenced your life, family or community.
- Share how you have contributed to your community, along with your volunteer efforts.
- Tell us about a time you failed and what you learned from it.
- Please explain why you need the scholarship and how you will use this scholarship to pursue your academic/career goals?

Scan and email your most recent transcript with your cumulative GPA.

Video essays should use the following labeling format:

- For high school students:
HS_NAME OF SCHOOL_LAST NAME_FIRST NAME
- For college students:
COL_NAME OF SCHOOL_LAST NAME_FIRST NAME
- For postgraduate students:
POSTGR_LAST NAME_FIRST NAME
