#### Dear Seneca Falls Central School District Residents,

At the April 10, 2025, Board of Education meeting, the Seneca Falls Central School District BOE adopted a proposed spending plan of \$38,180,389. Our proposed tax levy increase of 2% is under the maximum allowable tax levy limit of 4.34% for our district. The budget we have prepared is reflective of our renewed effort to provide quality education while being fiscally responsible.

The 2025-2026 budget will support our literacy instruction, researchbased practices in the Science of Reading, and training for all PreK-5 teachers. We will continue our instructional shifts in reading and look forward to the work needed to support the New York Inspires initiatives that will broaden pathway experiences for our secondary-level students.

Increasing our graduation rates, enhancing school safety, and supporting the social and emotional health of our students remain at the forefront of our efforts. The budget outlined in this newsletter was created to maintain current programming and promote the district vision and mission. Additionally, our new district goals that will take effect on July 1, 2025, will focus on Academic Excellence and Future Readiness, Safe and Supportive Learning Environments for All, and Connections and Collaborations. Our district goals are fiscally supported in our 2025-2026 budget.



#### PROPERTY TAX LEVY

New York State law requires school districts to establish a tax cap, or maximum allowable levy limit. Allowable Levy is set at the Cost of Living, CPI (2.95%) or the state's tax cap of 2%, whichever is less. The SFCSD proposed 2.00% Tax Levy increase is below the SFCSD Maximum Allowable Levy Limit of 4.34%.

#### WHERE AND HOW DO I VOTE?

All Seneca Falls Central School District voters must be U.S. Citizens, at least 18 years of age, and a resident of the school district for the past 30 days. Voting on the School Budget, Bus Purchases and the election of members of the Board of Education will take place from **12:00 to 8:00 PM on Tuesday, May 20, 2025** in the **Operations Center (2 Butler Ave)**. The annual public hearing for the school budget will be on Thursday, May 8th at 6:00 PM. The public hearing will be in the Robert McKeveny Training Room at the Operations Center. #### **BALLOT PROPOSITIONS**

- **PROPOSITION #1:** Be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca County is hereby authorized to expend the sum of thirty-eight million, one-hundred eighty-thousand, three hundred eighty-nine dollars (\$38,180,389) in the 2025-2026 school year with such amount to be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of such School District, after first deducting the monies available from State Aid and other sources as provided by law.
- **PROPOSITION #2:** Be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca County is hereby authorized to purchase five (5) buses for the transportation of district students, for a sum of money not to exceed nine- hundred, ninety-five thousand dollars (\$995,000); said amount to be expended in the 2025-2026 fiscal year; said sum or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be withdrawn from the district's "Capital Reserve Fund-Purchase of Buses" and/or the unassigned fund balance, in accordance with the Education Law and Local Finance Law.
- **PROPOSITION #3:** Be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Seneca Falls Central School District, Seneca County, NY is hereby authorized to withdraw from the "Technology Equipment & Infrastructure Capital Reserve Fund 2024" a sum of money up to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) to be expended for technology equipment upgrades consistent with the authorizing resolution.
- **PROPOSITION #4:** Shall the sum of three-hundred, eighty-seven thousand dollars (\$387,000.00) be raised by annual levy of a tax upon the taxable property within the Seneca Falls Central School District for the purpose of funding the Seneca Falls Library?
