VALLE VISTA LEAGUE SYMPOSIUM

Northview High School had 10 student-athletes representing our school at the Valle Vista League Symposium last month. Our students completed a series of leadership activities and workshops. Students got to hear from several speakers including Kevin Glaspay (Covina Athletic Director), Thom Simmons (CIF-SS Asst. Commissioner), and Taylor Martinez (CIF-SS Communications Coordinator). In attendance were Northview Athletic Directors David Ochoa and Marcel Perez along with ASB Director, Lindsey Vorndran.



Attendance Update

October 31st was our 50th day of school. As a reminder, we track attendance every 25 days and we use the following criteria to designate the Excellent, Basic, and Chronic attendance categories:

Excellent Attendance: 0 or 1 absence.

Basic Attendance: 2 absences. **Chronically Absent:** 3 or more absences. For our 2nd 25-day period of the school year (from September 27 to October 31), we made great improvements as a school. Our Excellent Attendance category increased by over 1% and our Chronically Absent category decreased by over 1%. Overall, as a school through the first 50 days of instruction, 74.05% of our students have missed 0, 1, or 2 days of school, which is an amazing accomplishment. We will continue to work with the 121 students and families that have already missed more than 6 days of school. Remember that the best way to ensure student learning is to be at school with your teachers and peers every single day. Our November Attendance Challenge will be revealed in the next few days. Keep up the great work, Vikings!
