Elementary Education

- The Indian River School District has recently implemented a new reading curriculum, Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA) for Pre-K-5th grade students.
 - This new reading curriculum is aligned to the Science of Reading, providing students with foundational skills instruction that is systematic and explicit, beginning with the sounds first approach in kindergarten.


This chart shows the amount of growth that our students have made from the beginning of the year to the middle of the year compared to the national averages.



- DIBELS or the *Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills* is a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of literacy skills.
- These measures are used to regularly detect risk and monitor the development of early literacy and early reading skills in students Kindergarten - 8th grade.

Secondary

- The district is in the process of selecting a new high-quality ELA middle and high school curriculum that will build on the skills and knowledge students are learning through CKLA or Core Knowledge Language Arts.
- In math, our Carnegie Learning math curriculum focuses on developing deep conceptual understanding while also providing an adaptive tool, MATHia, that meets students where they are to promote student growth in math skills.

- The class of 2025 has been offered \$22.6 million in merit scholarships.
- We have a current total of 923 college acceptances.
- Several students have been accepted to Ivy League schools.
- College acceptances span from local universities to Argentina.
- Some students are planning to attend traditional HBCU's-DSU, UMES, and Shaw University.
- Some seniors are entering the National Guard, US Army; and some are entering career-related programs such as cosmetology school, CDL training, and real estate.

INTERESTING TO NOTE...

- Between 2022 and 2024, Delaware's recovery in math was second in the nation (Washington, D.C. was first); however, no state has returned to its 2019 levels in either math or reading. (Education Recovery Scorecard, February 2025).
- States that are below expectations on NAEP have seen a steady increase in chronic absenteeism from 2019. Delaware is one of those states from 15% in 2019 to 23% in 2023. Indian River School District has increased from 19% to 23%.
- Additionally, Delaware does not mandate summer school or grade retention based on student performance on state or national exams, unlike the nine states who consistently meet or exceed NAEP performance in reading and math.
