We want to hear about your experience with your child's education. We invite you to participate in completing the Feedback and Input Survey. This survey includes questions about your personal experiences in our school and will give you the chance to share your ideas about how to make school safer and more supportive. Your responses will be very helpful for us in improving student relationships, learning conditions, and the overall school environment.

Beginning today, 4/28/25, we invite all parents, guardians, and caretakers to complete this survey for our school. The survey is completely anonymous and brief; it contains 24 items, 11 open-ended questions, and takes about 5-10 minutes to complete. (If you cannot access this online survey, please pick up a paper copy in your school office, complete it, and leave it in the box designated for that purpose.) Please submit your responses by 5/16/25.

All your responses are completely anonymous. We have no way to connect you to your answers, and results will only be reported as group responses. There are no right or wrong answers. We just want to know about your personal experiences. Responses are housed securely and in an anonymous format with the University of Oregon Technical Assistance Center projects for evaluation research purposes. All evaluation research projects are in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, (343 CFR 99.31 (6)) and human subjects regulations (Protection of Human Subjects 45 CFR 46).

As you respond to each item, think about your own personal experiences as a parent, caregiver or guardian at your child's school. You can mark "I prefer not to answer" and any other items blank if you don't want to answer a question.

We hope you will take the time to provide us with this valuable information. Feel free to call our office at 570-894-4900 if you have any questions. Each school's results will be used to improve our school's behavior support systems.

Federal Programs Updates

All elementary schools within the district are Title I schoolwide schools and receive Title I federal funds to support the positions of Interventionist and Title I Associates. We determine how to use the funding to staff our buildings based on family input and our school data. If you are interested in becoming a part of our Title I team, please reach out to your building Interventionist or principal. Our Policy 917/918 meetings are a great place to start, because we always review our School Improvement plans and the most updated school data during those meetings.

At all school levels, we use Title IV federal funds to purchase incentives for PBIS (our positive school-wide behavior supports) rewards, and we emphasize the goal of following school rules in all schools.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

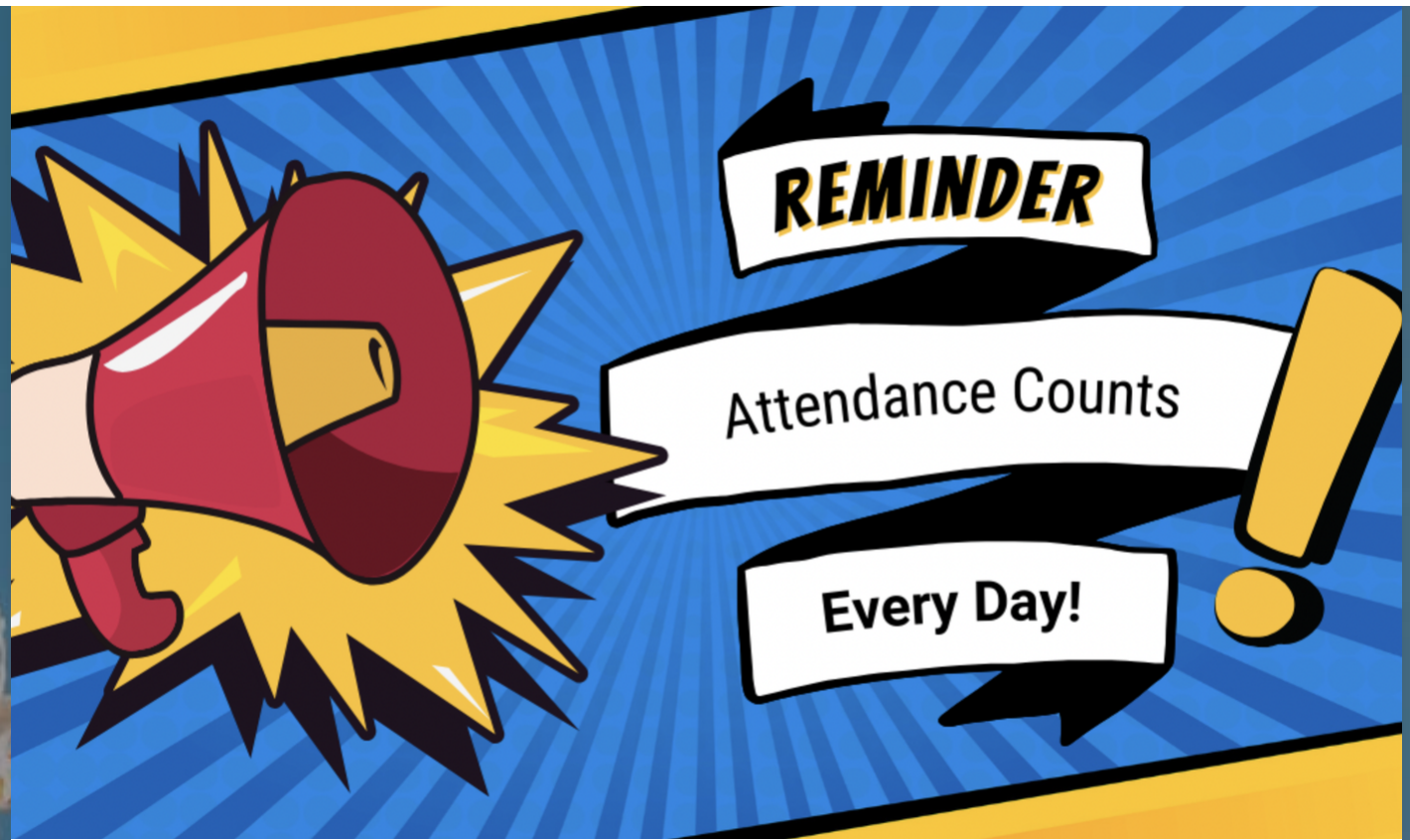
We're so excited to have our schools filled with students and teachers where we can all grow and learn together!

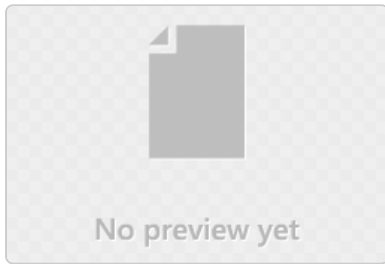

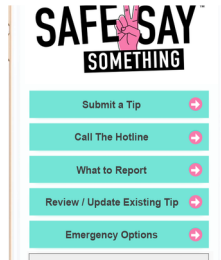
