RE:	Charter School Updates			

#### Summary:

According to the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) and Utah Code § 53G-5, charter schools must maintain regular communication with their authorizer— in this case, the Board of Education for SLCSD —and update them on material changes. These include, but are not limited to:

- Changes in leadership or governance (e.g., board members, directors)
- Amendments to the charter agreement
- Academic or financial performance concerns
- Relocation of the school or changes to grade configurations
- Major policy shifts that affect operations or compliance

Additionally, Utah Admin. Code R277-552 and related charter authorizer handbooks often require strategic updates, and approval for any significant changes. Inn this case, we are presenting a strategic update for the Board.





**Demographics: Salt Lake School District and SLCSE** 



Students Experiencing Positive Well Being at School





## Median Growth Percentile (Aspire+): Students At Risk



Subgroup of Students At Risk




## Median Growth Percentile (Aspire+): Students At Risk

## Median Growth Percentile (Aspire+): Content Area





## ACT Scores by Content Area: State - District - School Comparison










### **Graduation Rates for High Schools in Salt Lake District**
