Below you will find the Entry Criteria, Program Requirements and Earnings of an MCI Graduate

ENTRY CRITERIA

- GPA of at least a 3.0
- Completion of 1 High School Math Class with a C or higher
 - Algebra 1 or Geometry
- Qualifying Reading/Writing PERT Scores*
- Submission of application

REQUIREMENTS

- Maintain a 3.0 Unweighted GPA
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA in all Dual Enrollment courses
- No D's or F's
- Earn a qualifying Math PERT score**

EARNINGS

- 60+ college credits
- Their Associate of Arts degree from Daytona State College
- The opportunity to transfer to at least one Florida public university

*Qualifying PERT scores include a 106 on the Reading and a 103 on the Writing

**Qualifying Math PERT score 114 by the end of their 10th grade year
