Budget Message from the Board of Trustees for Fiscal Year 2025-2026

Exciting things are happening at the Baldwin Public Library. The community's longed-for dream to renovate the building, including the nearly 8,000 square feet of raw space on the upper level, has come to fruition. The project, which includes a second large meeting room, several small study / meeting spaces, a Maker Space, a larger Teen Space, a completely renovated Children's Room, and more is underway.

During the entire process, we will be here to serve you with the range of high-caliber programs and services you have come to expect, both in-person and online. The proposed budget reflects this commitment. Our robust physical collection is complemented by a vast collection of online resources that are available 24/7, such as eBooks, downloadable audiobooks, digital magazines, and streaming movies. Our community can also access materials from other libraries, be they down the road or across the country, and they can be picked up any time of the day or night from our Smart Lockers. We have also launched new services, such as our Seed Library and our Library of Things. All of this takes place due to the efforts of our superb, professional staff.

The fiscal year 2025-2026 budget includes an average increase of \$120 per household. This includes a base tax levy increase of \$355,973, or 7.58%, which is above the tax cap. In addition to the usual increases in utilities and other services that we have each year, this will ensure that the Library will be able to adequately staff the second floor when it reopens, which will take place during this fiscal year. This is the first time the Library will have pierced the cap since the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

We are also *required* to pierce the cap to account for the debt service (that is, the repayment of the principal and interest) on the bond. This amount was previously approved by the Baldwin community during the 2023 vote by a margin of 3 to 1, so the receipt of these funds will not be affected by the outcome of this year's vote. A public library is not permitted to separate out capital projects from its levy.

Mensaje de presupuesto de la Junta de Fideicomisarios para el año fiscal 2025-2026

Cosas emocionantes están sucediendo en la Biblioteca Pública de Baldwin. El anhelado sueño de la comunidad de renovar el edificio, incluidos los casi 8,000 pies cuadrados de espacio en bruto en el nivel superior, se ha hecho realidad. El proyecto, que incluye una segunda gran sala de reuniones, varios pequeños espacios de estudio / reunión, un espacio de creación (Maker Space), un espacio para adolescentes más grande, una sala para niños completamente renovada y más, está en marcha.

Durante todo el proceso, estaremos aquí para servirle con la gama de programas y servicios de alto calibre que espera, tanto en persona como en línea. El proyecto de presupuesto refleja este compromiso. Nuestra sólida colección física se complementa con una amplia colección de recursos en línea que están disponibles las 24 horas del día, los 7 días de la semana, como libros electrónicos, audiolibros descargables, revistas digitales y películas en streaming. Nuestra comunidad también puede acceder a materiales de otras bibliotecas, ya sea en la calle o en todo el país, y se pueden recoger en cualquier momento del día o de la noche en nuestros casilleros inteligentes (Smart Lockers). También hemos lanzado nuevos servicios, como nuestra Biblioteca de Cosas. Todo esto se lleva a cabo gracias a los esfuerzos de nuestro excelente personal profesional.

El presupuesto del año fiscal 2025-2026 incluye un aumento promedio de \$120 per hogar. Esto incluye un aumento de la recaudación del impuesto básico de \$355,973, o 7.58%, que está por encima del límite impositivo (Tax Cap). Además de los aumentos habituales en los servicios públicos y otros servicios que tenemos cada año, esto asegurará que la Biblioteca pueda dotar de personal adecuado en el segundo piso cuando vuelva a abrir, lo que se llevará a cabo durante este año fiscal. Esta es la primera vez que la Biblioteca ha traspasado el límite desde el año fiscal 2014-2015.

También estamos obligados a perforar el tope para dar cuenta del servicio de la deuda (es decir, el pago del principal y los intereses) del bono. Esta cantidad fue aprobada previamente por la comunidad de Baldwin durante la votación de 2023 por un margen de 3 a 1, por lo que la recepción de estos fondos no se verá afectada por el resultado de la votación de este año. Una biblioteca pública no se nos permite separar los proyectos de capital de los gravamen fiscal.




