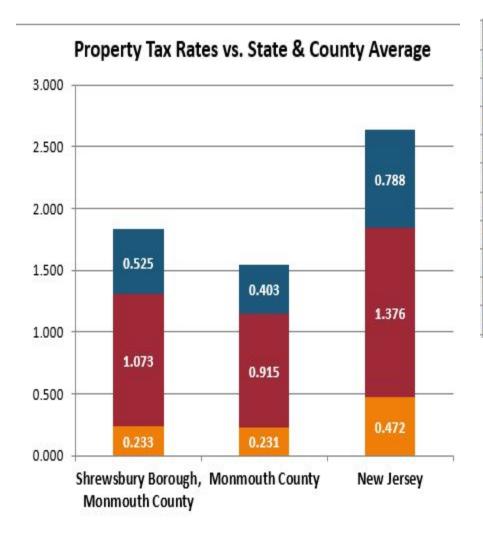

Fund Breakdown

General Fund = \$11,282,765

- **Local Tax Levy** (\$9,653,276) money collected by taxes from the community
- **Miscellaneous Revenue** (\$1,629,489)
 - □ **State Aid** (\$617,848 of the \$1,629,489)
 - □ Special Education Categorical Aid supplements Federal allocations under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act
 - □ Security Aid
 - ☐ Transportation Aid
 - Extraordinary Aid
 - **Tuition** (\$220,000 of \$1,629,489)
 - □ **Interest** (\$7,000 of \$1,629,489)
 - Excess Surplus (must have a minimum of 2%)
 - Reserve Withdrawal

Fund Breakdown

Special Revenue Fund = \$154,389

- State Grants ESSA Every Student Succeeds Act There are 9 titles of which SBS qualifies for 3:

Debt Service Fund = \$1,682,500

- □ Principal and interest payments on bonds approved in previous referendum for additions and renovations on school buildings
- □ Shrewsbury Tax Levy \$1,380,010
- ☐ State Aid Debt Service \$ 302,490 (3rd year as a tax savings)

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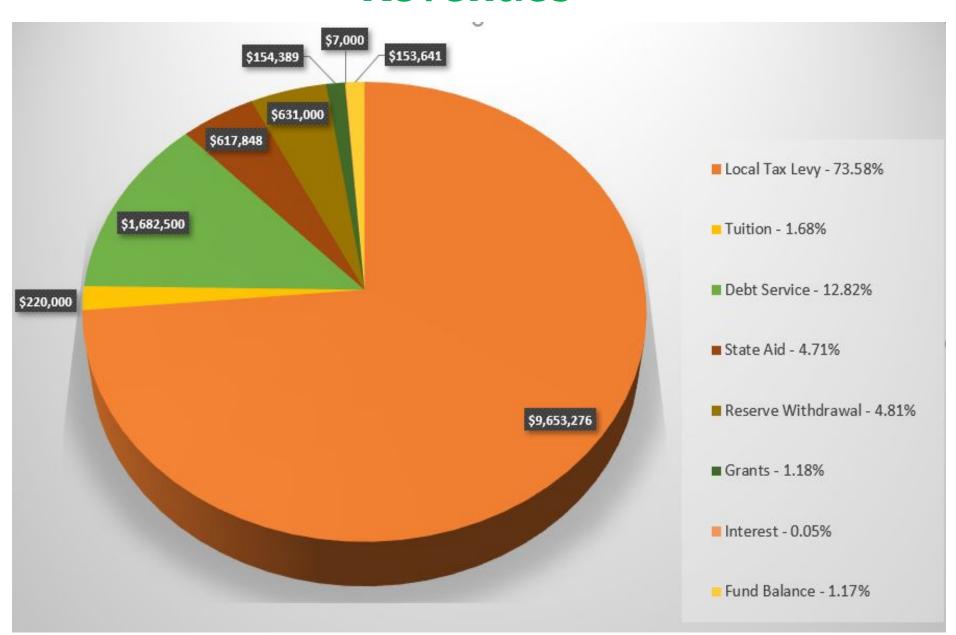

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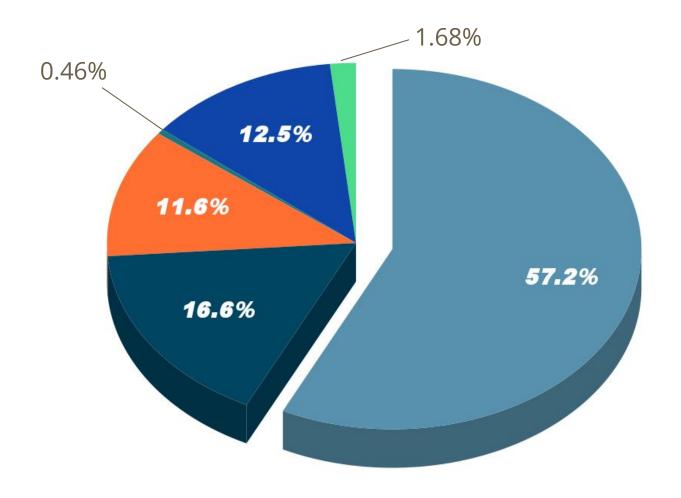

How will the budget be spent?





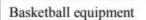

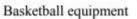
