

In a shelter

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or family conflict

## You may be eligible for certain rights and protections under the law.

## **ELIGIBLE STUDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:**

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment such as a birth certificate, immunization record and proof of address.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- Receive transportation assistance to and from the school of origin upon request and a best interest determination.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.
- Receive a written explanation from the school district with directions on your right to appeal any decisions.
- Receive referrals to community resources for medical, dental, vision and housing needs.
