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Proposed Code of Conduct Updates for 2025–2026:

On April 28th, Olean City School District hosted a Family Forum to review proposed changes to the 2025–2026 Code of Conduct. Key updates include:

- Students may only use school-issued laptops or iPads—personal devices like tablets or personal laptops will no longer be allowed during the school day.
- Corporal punishment and physical restraints are now addressed in separate sections for clarity.
- Visitor procedures have been updated to reflect the district's use of the Raptor system.
- A new discipline flow chart was introduced for Olean Intermediate-Middle School.

Parents shared helpful feedback, including questions about smartwatches, visitor vs. volunteer procedures, and the inclusion of parent notification in the discipline matrix. A productive discussion also took place regarding the district's physical restraint policies. We appreciate everyone who attended and contributed to the conversation. Your input helps bring improvements to our schools.

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Farm to School Launches First Elementary Taste Test:




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


