Dear SFIS Family,

We're near the end. I know it's early, but congratulations to all our Seniors. We will miss each of them, but they'll all do amazing things out in the "real world." Special shoutout to the students who were in my Health and Wellness weekly course some years ago. On behalf of all the dorm staff, we're proud to see our students reach the end of their academic journey at SFIS. Graduation, for all of us, is more than a ceremony, it's a celebration of all the work and growth our students have achieved over their time here at SFIS. I hope that as a parent you feel you've seen your student grow from their time in the Student Living program.

An important reminder, the Friday academic class schedule for certain days in May allows for an early release for students at 2:00pm. The following dates are considered Early Release: May 2nd, 9th, & 16th. For the Memorial, you should have seen some communicated out adjustments made on the 2nd. On the other days the available southbound train departures for the Rail Runner times are 2:52 pm and 4:20pm. Please call your student's SLA or RA each week by Thursday to authorize your student(s) to ride the Friday train home. In accordance with the Superintendent's letters last month, students are required to take the transportation provided by the school. Sundays do have provided transport for the 4:50PM and the 7:50PM trains back to campus. We do remind parents to be considerate in the amount of items sent back, most notably too many snacks removes the available seats per ride. Taos Shuttle services end on May 9th, with no more return services. Rail Runner services will end on May 16th, with no more return services, as well.

The End of the School Year will be here before we know it. The dorms close at 6PM on Friday, May 23rd, 2025. We do encourage families as we get closer to the end of the year to take some of your student's belongings back early each week, if able. We do want that Final Checkout Day to be a smooth process for all involved. Also, I'm requesting parent support for students to fulfill their responsibilities to the program going into the end of the year. Maintaining our facilities as a family is important to ensuring that our dormitory continues to serve students for decades to come. Please, don't encourage the behavior of your students avoiding major "scrub days" to shirk their responsibilities to the program, especially in that last week. Our buildings have "taken care" of all of us, so we must give that spirit back to them.

May 10th: 1st Floor Boys


May 17th: 2nd Floor Boys
