#### 1. Purchase of District Chromebooks

Jeff Cassin, Director of Technology, recommended the purchase of 650 Chromebooks to replace existing equipment as part of the district's annual replacement plan. The Chromebooks will be purchased through the REMC cooperative purchasing program. Each Chromebook is \$296.00, and the necessary management license is \$29.80, for a total of \$325.80 per device. Therefore, the total cost for 650 devices is \$211,770.00, from Sehi Computer Products in Rochester Hills, Michigan. This purchase will be allocated to the sinking fund budget.
