Enrollment Application Process -School Year 2025- 2026

Scarborough Public Schools is excited to be offering a public Pre-K pilot program in the fall of 2025, to include one classroom of 16 students. This program occurs in partnership with Shooting Stars



Preschool, located at 152 Rt. 1 in Scarborough. Shooting Stars is a high quality program which has been serving preschoolers for the last 20 years and we are extremely fortunate to be partnering with them. Through our enrollment process, we seek to serve children from each of our three neighborhood districts: Blue Point, Eight Corners, and Pleasant Hill.

Program Details:

The Scarborough Public Pre-K Pilot is...

- Free
- Open from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
- Aligned to the the Scarborough Public Schools' Calendar
- · Able to offer free lunch and snacks to students
- Open to all Scarborough residents who are turning 4 on or before Oct. 15, 2025
- Located at the Shooting Stars Preschool Program (152 Rt. 1, Scarborough)
- · Staffed by qualified, experienced, and certified Pre-K teachers
- Limited to a single classroom of 16 students, selected by an enrollment process
- An extension of the public school and is mandated to be in compliance with Maine statutes relating to student registration and immunizations

The Scarborough Public Pre-K Pilot is not...

- Able to provide transportation. Parents/guardians must drop off and pick up daily
- Able to accommodate students with significantly specialized educational needs
- Able to accommodate all students who apply

Enrollment Process:

Please fill out the Pre-K Enrollment Form if you would like your child to be considered for the Fall 2025 Pre-K Pilot Program. All names must be submitted by **May 2, 2025**. The Pre-K team will sort applications by the anticipated neighborhood school. Names will then be selected at random from each pool of names. Students who are selected will be invited to attend a screening. Children will be screened at Shooting Stars in early May by appointment between 2:30-4:00.

Enrollment decisions will be made after students have been screened. Parents/guardians will be notified that their child has been invited to attend the program and will be given a timeline to accept or deny.

The enrollment process will be ongoing until all seats are filled.

2025-2026 School Calendar Approved!

At the March 6th board meeting, the board approved the 2025-2026 calendar. It is very similar to this year's calendar, and will allow for up to three "traditional snow days" (or any type of unplanned "no school" days). If more than the allotted three days are needed, those days will be **asynchronous** remote learning days, consistent with how the school calendar has looked like for the past few years.



Update from the Scarborough Board of Education



Building Committee: Working steadily toward the goal of narrowing down to one option from the two preferred options. There was a community forum on 4/30 at town hall that was well attended in person and online and a <u>survey</u> is currently underway through May 12th which will help guide the committee. The next meetings are May 5th, 12th, and 19th @ 6pm at Town Hall.

communications Committee: Working toward community engagement efforts and continuing to work through the best way to communicate with the loss of the weekly publication of the leader being delivered to mailboxes. Looking forward to next year's senior citizen appreciation dinner and already planning some for that. The nex spotlight award will be May 15th!

Curriculum Committee: Summer planning is well underway. Invitations have been sent out for incoming 6th grade middle schoolers for the connections academy and already preparing for summer reading academy, kindercamp, and credit recovery programs. The Board approved the Climate Education Professional Development Grant that would provide funding for summer professional development, monthly 2-hour professional development/planning sessions, instructional supplies, and contracted service with a Maine TREE Foundation consultant. The grant encourages outdoor education and fosters a deeper connection to nature and the Scarborough community.

Finance Committee: All school budget materials can be found at www.scarboroughschools.org/board/budget. The second reading of the school budget was May 1, 2025. Due to changes in Pre-K funding and Anthem rates, the budget has changed. Meanwhile, the town council has also requested that the school reduce the school budget to meet the town's goal of reducing the projected tax rate to be under 4%. Thus, the following amendments were approved.

Negotiations Committee: The committee is still meeting with collective bargaining units. The goal is to have all three contracts done by the end of the school year

Policy Committee: Working through updates to Title IX policies, and then working back through oldest policies to get those up to date.

Round Table Update: The town has made some additions to the budget pickleball courts, lights at peterson baseball field, full time public safety positions

Student Liaisons Update:

<u>Abby</u>: Earlier in April there was an author visit at Wentworth where the students were able to learn more about the process as an author and illustrator. Also spring sports at the high school have started and they have all had strong starts.

This was the first week back after our spring break and the phone policy was fully implemented at the high school where we now put our phones in phone trees for every class and at least in my classes I can say it has gone smoothly.

The SMS Theater Team put on four performances of the musical, Matilda Jr. from April 11-13. The students did an amazing job performing in front of packed houses and received standing ovations. Thank you to director: Jessie Dumais, producer: Bethany Jensen, choral director: Matt LaBerge, and many others for their support in leading the students through these performances.

<u>Grace</u>: At the high school, Mr. Theriault, Mrs. Blaisdell, and Mr. Brown all participated in the USC ice bucket challenge to raise awareness for mental health. Seniors participated in Decision Day today, where they wore the merch of the college they will be attending in the fall!

Work Permits



Work Permit Information for Minors Under 16 Years Old

Once a minor under 16 years old has the promise of a job, they must obtain a work permit before beginning that job. This includes students who are homeschooled. They must get a new permit every time they begin a new job until they reach 16 years old, even

if they work for their parents.

In order to apply for a work permit, the minor must be:

- enrolled in school
- not habitually truant or under suspension; and
- passing a majority of courses during the current grading period.

A copy of the <u>Maine Work Permit Form can be downloaded here</u>. Once this form is completed and signed, the work permit application should be delivered to the superintendent's office (Scarborough Town Hall, 259 US Route 1) with a **copy of the minor's birth certificate, passport or permanent resident card**. You may also email this information to Melissa Booth (mbooth@scarboroughschools.org) If you have general questions please call Melissa at 207-730-4100.

The superintendent's office will forward the information to the Maine Department of Labor. This process could take up to one week. If the permit is in order, the MDOL will validate/approve the form. A staff member at the superintendent's office will email a copy of the approved work permit to the student and the parent/guardian who gave permission for the permit.

- 1. Minors should bring the approved work permit to their new employer.
- 2. A minor can have one active permit during the school year and two during the summer.

- If your child has specific health concerns, you can call or set up an appointment with one of our school nurses at any time.
