### The test is given in two parts.

- Part 1 is the writing portion of the test.
  - Part 1 is administered earlier. The dates are below.
- Part 2 is the multiple choice portion of the test.
  - Part 2 is administered during final exam week.

English 2 classes will begin taking the writing component of the English 2 South Carolina EOCEP on Thursday, May 1st.. Testing will begin promptly at 8:30 AM.

## IB Exam Information

IB Exams start next week and run daily from April 29 – May 16. Below is the IB Exam Schedule.

1. Students with **morning IB exam sessions** should report to the hallway outside the \*auxiliary gym **between 8:00 and 8:15 AM.**
2. For **afternoon IB exam sessions**, students should **leave class at 11:45 to report to the hallway near the auxiliary gym to eat their lunches before going into testing.**
3. **PLEASE CHECK THE AFTERNOON EXAM SCHEDULE CAREFULLY** because some days with **longer testing sessions in the afternoon may run past the 3:30 bell.** We will always TRY to get students out before 3:30, but some days can run a little past that time.

*\*Two IB exams will NOT be held in the auxiliary gym. Students will be directed to classrooms for these tests:*

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# Online Tutoring Program at HHIHS

We are excited to inform you that there is a new online tutoring program available at HHIHS. This program was created by HHIHS student Bess Tuczynski. The program is designed to help all students at HHIHS get the tutoring they need, in the time that they are available. And it is completely free for all participants.



Based on feedback, one of the biggest challenges for students is to find the time to attend early morning or after school tutoring due to athletics and/or transportation. The goal of this virtually based program is to allow those same students to get the effective tutoring they need to be successful throughout their high school careers at a convenient time.

With this program, students in the National Honors Societies at the high school will provide the tutoring, while earning volunteer hours for their time. The tutoring sessions are completely confidential so only the tutor, student and teacher will be aware of who takes part in the program. 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## Beginning/End of the School Year Information

### 1. Returning Students - Online Registration

- If your child is a rising 9th grader from Hilton Head Island Middle School or a returning student, the Beaufort County School District will send the InfoSnap Online Registration link and access code around mid-July. **Completion of this online registration is required annually.**
  - *The registration notification will be sent via email. If your email address or phone number has changed, please contact [mercybel.tricochecruz@beaufort.12.sc.us](mailto:mercybel.tricochecruz@beaufort.12.sc.us) as soon as possible to update your contact information.*

### 2. Proof of Residency

- **Proof of residency must be re-submitted at the beginning of each new school year.** Two documents are required—one from each of the following sections:
  - Section 1 (provide one):**
    - Real estate tax bill
    - Current signed lease
    - Military housing letter
    - Section 8 letter
  - Section 2 (provide one):**
    - Utility bill
    - Landline phone bill
    - Cable bill
    - Current car insurance declarations page
    - Vehicle registration

***Reminder: If your address changes, you are required to notify the school within 30 calendar days.***

### 3. Non-returning Students

- If your child will not be returning to our school for the 2025–2026 school year, an official withdrawal must be completed. This process can be done on your child's last day

of attendance or any time before August 6, the first day of the new school year.

**To complete the withdrawal process, the following are required:**

- New home address (if applicable)
- New school's full name, address, and phone number
- Payment of any outstanding fees (can be paid online or in person)
- Parent/guardian photo identification

**Return of all school-issued items:**

- Tablet
- Tablet charger
- Tablet bag
- Textbooks
- Uniforms

**4. Guardianship Affidavits**

- If you are not the biological parent of the student, a Guardianship Affidavit must be completed each school year. The 2025–2026 affidavit will be available upon request from Ms. Cruz (see contact information below).
- The completed affidavit must be notarized and accompanied by one of the following supporting documents:
  - A notarized letter from the biological parent
  - Documentation from the Department of Social Services
  - Legal guardianship documentation

**Important Reminder:**

When enrolling a child in this school district as a guardian, you accept full responsibility for all educational decisions, attendance, behavioral matters, and other school-related obligations.

If guardianship status changes, the current guardian is required to submit a notarized letter to the school indicating the change. This letter must include the full name, address, and phone number of the new guardian. The new guardian must then complete a new affidavit for the school year and provide updated proof of residency and contact information.

Please continue to monitor your child's grades and attendance in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. The last day to make up seat time for the first semester was yesterday at Saturday School. All those students who have not made up the time in the classes in which they have received an FA (failure due to absences and tardies) will have the FA remain as a grade. An FA is the equivalent of receiving a grade of 50. The 50 will be factored into a student's GPA (grade point average) as well as impacting class rank.

**Beginning March 15<sup>th</sup>, we will begin to have Saturday School for those students who have fallen below the seat requirement for one or more of their classes during the second semester.**

## Personal Communication Device Policy

This fall Beaufort County School District instituted a Personal Electronic and Communication Device Policy. For students in PreK through 8<sup>th</sup> grade the policy stated that all personal and communication devices must be turned off and stored in a locker, pocket, purse, backpack, or other non-visible secure





location from the school start time to the school end time. For high school students the same policy applied except high school students could use their devices during lunch in the cafeteria. However, as expected the SC State Department of Education has created a state policy for all public schools. Therefore, when HHIHS students return to school after winter break on January 8<sup>th</sup> all personal and electronic and communication devices must be turned off and stored. **They cannot be used from 8:30am to 3:30pm each school day.**

Here is the automatic reply when a parent requests early dismissal for the student.

*“Thank you for submitting your early release request. No early dismissals 30 minutes prior to the end of the school day. For example: Half days, not after 12 pm and Regular days, not after 3 pm”*

**Please read the early release procedures below as some of the process has been updated.**

1. We receive & approve the request. **Requests must be submitted before noon each regular school day or 10:00 am on half days.**
2. Please let the student know there is a dismissal request.
3. The student should show the teacher their early release pass which will be used as a pass out of class and to the front desk.
4. For the safety of our students, we require that any person who will be picking up a student during the school day come into the building and show their ID. The person who is picking up a student will only be permitted to take the student with them if they are listed in PowerSchool.
5. If a student is driving themselves, they will be permitted to sign out and leave at the time listed on their early release note.
