COLUMBIA CITY ELEMENTARY — BIRD BEAK EXPLORATION

Our curious first graders at **Columbia City Elementary** recently took part in an engaging Bird Beak Exploration activity as part of their science learning. Students rotated through hands-on stations that simulated how different bird beaks are adapted to gather food in various environments.



Using tools that represented different beak shapes, students explored how birds might pick up worms, scoop fish, sip nectar, open shells for seeds, and collect bugs. They also got creative by using playdough to sculpt their own bird heads and beaks!

At each station, students answered three important questions:

- 1. What tool was best to pick up the food?
- 2. Why was it helpful?
- 3. What type of bird might have that type of beak?







This interactive experience helped students better understand how form fits function in the animal world, and they had a lot of fun while doing it!

MYSTERY READER FUN IN PRESCHOOL



Columbia City, McBride, and Lewis & Clark Elementary preschools created a mystery readers program where a surprise guest from the community visits our preschools to read the students stories.

The goal? To show our students that adults in our community love reading just as much as they do! Teachers provide fun clues before the guest arrives, and the students love trying to guess who the Mystery Reader might be.

This week, at McBride Elementary, our Mystery Readers were firefighters from Columbia River Fire & Rescue. After reading a story to the students, they showed off their gear, answered lots of curious questions, and shared how they help keep our community safe. The visit sparked excitement, inspired awe, and reminded us all that reading and community connection go hand in hand.



Students Dive into Physics with OMSI Assembly

Students at Lewis & Clark Elementary recently enjoyed an exciting and educational assembly presented by OMSI (Oregon Museum of Science and Industry). The interactive presentation focused on physics, with a special spotlight on Sir Isaac Newton and his Laws of Motion.

Throughout the assembly, young scientists had the opportunity to participate in hands-on experiments that brought the Laws of Motion to life. From exploring inertia to witnessing the effects of action and reaction, students were fully engaged in learning through discovery and fun.










STUDENTS ATTEND CESAR E. CHAVEZ LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE



St. Helens High School students recently had the opportunity to attend the Cesar E. Chavez Leadership Conference, where they connected with peers from across the region to learn about leadership, advocacy, and higher education pathways.



The day began with an inspiring keynote address from a first-generation college graduate who shared her personal journey navigating college and building a successful career. Throughout the day, students attended engaging workshops focused on topics such as local government, policy-making, and legislative advocacy. One session highlighted the history of the conference itself, where students had the unique experience of meeting one of the original co-founders, an advocate who, in the 1970s, worked tirelessly to support university access for students of color.



The conference concluded with a college fair, giving students the chance to speak directly with university representatives and explore future academic opportunities.

This meaningful experience encouraged students to reflect on their own goals while learning from leaders who continue to inspire change in their communities.
















St. Helens High School Leadership team was honored with the OASC Gold Council Award—the highest recognition a student leadership program can receive from the Oregon Association of Student Councils.

School Board Candidate ONLINE Forum on Tuesday, May 6, 2025, from 4:45 PM - 5:45 PM. This event will be livestreamed from the district's YouTube channel.

This professionally moderated event, led by a representative from the Oregon School Boards Association, is an opportunity to hear from the candidates running for the school board and learn more about their vision and priorities for our district.

St. Helens School Board Candidate Forum - Update & Exciting Community Opportunities

We are excited to share an important update to our upcoming school board candidate forum. We've decided to transition the forum, originally scheduled as an in-person event, to a **live-streamed online format.** This adjustment was made in response to community feedback and in an effort to ensure accessibility, neutrality, and transparency. This change also allows us to create a welcoming space for all candidates and community members, while avoiding potential scheduling conflicts and concerns about logistics.

The virtual format offers several benefits: more people will be able to attend from any location, the event can be recorded and shared afterward, and we can ensure a smooth, well-facilitated discussion. The forum will include an opportunity for all candidates to answer questions submitted by students, staff, and community representatives, providing a thoughtful and balanced platform for all voters to hear from those seeking to serve on the school board.

To help ensure a respectful, balanced conversation, we've partnered with the **Oregon School Boards Association** (**OSBA**) to provide a **professional, neutral moderator.** OSBA is the governing organization that supports and trains public school boards across the state, including our own. Their mission is to empower boards with the knowledge and tools to lead effectively and improve student outcomes:

Most recently, OSBA facilitated a well-received **candidate forum for the** <u>Seaside School District.</u> We are hopeful that by partnering with this trusted organization, we can provide a **professional, inclusive platform** for all voices to be heard

Due to the shift to an online format, the **moderation fee has been reduced to \$195.00.** While participation in the event remains free for attendees, this cost ensures professional moderation, neutrality, and that all candidates' voices are heard.

We adjusted the time and format of our event to accommodate the in-person forum being organized independently by St. Helens School Board candidates and a community moderator. Our goal is to avoid conflicting events and to encourage the highest possible community participation by giving space for both forums to take place.

We are grateful to our engaged community and to the candidates for participating in these events. A robust conversation with candidates fosters transparency, civic involvement, and informed decision-making.
