Rosana's dedication, hard work, and generosity to CT earned her the affectionate nickname, "Mother of Cambodia Town." As someone who believed her college degree was a critical element for her success in achieving the "American dream," Rosana encouraged all students to pursue a higher education. Cambodia Town, Inc. names its scholarship program "The Rosana Chanou Memorial Scholarship" in her memory.

Mission Statement:

The objective of CT's Scholarship Program is to provide Southeast Asian American high school graduates with a scholarship to achieve higher levels of education. The program supports students who strive to preserve their culture and improve the community through volunteer activities.

<u>Scholarship Award</u>

The scholarship amount will vary depending on the number and qualifications of the applicants. The maximum individual award for 2025 will be \$1,500.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a Southeast Asian* American high school student graduating in June 2025
- Must be from Long Beach, Signal Hill, Lakewood, Bellflower, Cerritos, or Artesia
- Must have volunteered in a Southeast Asian community, for a Southeast Asian nonprofit organization, or in a community service project that benefited the Southeast Asian community
- Minimum GPA 2.8

*Southeast Asian countries: Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar (or Burma), Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste (East Timor), and Vietnam

Students who have volunteered for Cambodia Town will receive bonus points in the application scoring.

Application Requirements

- Complete the scholarship application before June 22, 2025.
- Provide a copy of their transcript.
- Two letters of reference from school staff, an employer, or a community leader.
- High school graduates must provide proof of acceptance to an accredited community college, vocational/trade school, or university/college

All materials must be received by the deadline date of June 22, 2025, at 5:00 p.m.
