What is Advisory?

- Small group of 10-14 students
- Faculty Advisory Leader
- Students begin every day here
- Activities: Sown to Grow, check-ins, games, community building, shared messaging, building community, preparation for community learning.
- Community Days: School-wide activities on identity, belonging, inclusivity, school values and shared expectations.

Sports Continued

- All athletes must be registered on FamilyID to participate in tryouts/practices/games.
- All athletes must attend the coaches informational meeting.
- All athletes must have an up to date physical with the nurse.
- Sports meet 4 times a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday) after school 2:30 - 4:00 - games/meet go longer
- Intramurals are the same but meet 2 times a week

Day Drama D

We have a full season each school year with performance, writing, directing, stage management, tech and design opportunities at all grade levels.

Each production is a major commitment for all involved.

We also participate in the Massachusetts Educational Theatre Guild (METG) Middle School Drama Festival each spring, as well as the METG workshops and contests in the fall.

This year, we performed the musical *Mean Girls jr.* in December, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* is coming up in May.

Fees

- Clubs: \$100 for the year allows your student to participate in any/all clubs (no fee for homework club and GSA).
- Drama: \$150 for the year allows your student to participate in any/all Day Drama productions and any/all clubs for the year.
- Sports: \$230 per sport with \$690 family cap.
- Intramurals: \$115 per sport.
- Financial assistance is always available
