## Umpqua Community College AAOT

The Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree is designed for students who may not know exactly what they want to major in, and want to keep their options open to explore multiple disciplines before deciding on a specific area of study. Additionally, it is designed to prepare students to succeed after transferring to public universities and to attain GPAs comparable to students who begin their education at those institutions. Students who attain these degrees will possess a wide range of knowledge and skills, as described in the categories below.

The AAOT Degree is conferred on students who complete a full lower division college transfer program meeting requirements set jointly by Oregon's community colleges and public universities. This degree provides for "block transfer" and all lower division general education requirements of the receiving institution are met. There may be special requirements for specific programs or schools, as well as requirements for admissions, foreign language, and cultural literacy. Students should work closely with RHS counselors, UCC advisors and faculty, and with representatives of the institution(s) to which they may transfer for specific details.
