

TUSD Concurrent High School Enrollment Form

This form **MUST** be signed off by the student's Counselor and Principal **prior** to student beginning the course
Credits will not be awarded on your TUSD transcript if no prior approval is obtained

- This form is to be used for students who wish to take acceleration or remediation courses.
- Students must obtain prior approval from both their site Principal and Counselor.
- The costs associated with taking these courses will be the responsibility of the student, parent or guardian.
- Counselors may require parents/students to provide course descriptions from their chosen online provider.
- Students interested in making up credits during the summer may elect to enroll in approved online courses
- English, Social Science, Science and Fine Art courses are not allowable for acceleration.
- PE is only allowable for 10th grade, and only if a student has 6 academic/academy courses on their schedule.
- A maximum of 40 total credits are allowable, and only from BYU online, Silicon Valley, and/or UC Scout.
- Concurrent enrollment high school courses will not be counted toward Valedictorian or Valedictorian tie-break.

Student is requesting to waive 5th and/or 6th periods in order to attend a Community College course.
 This form must be filled out completely and turned into the student's school counselor for evaluation prior to the start of the college course.

Qualifications: Student must be eligible at every marking period (Minimum 2.0 GPA, No F grades).
 Student must not be credit deficient.
Student must maintain good attendance at their current high school.

Additional Guidelines: Student must provide evidence that they are enrolled in the college course AND that the course has been paid for.
 Student must remain enrolled in the course for the entire time – if the course is dropped or changed, the student is responsible for informing the counselor **IMMEDIATELY**.
 If this waiver is granted, student must leave campus immediately after their last assigned class.

If the student's status changes and they do not meet the qualifications above at any time, or if they fail to follow all of the guidelines, this wavier may be revoked.

If the student returns to their current high school to start attending 5th and 6th periods at any time after this waiver is approved, they will be placed in classes at the sole discretion of the school counselor, and these cannot be changed.





Every college gets to choose their own recommendation requirements. You can find more details on each college's "College Information" page.

If you're planning to apply this school year, you can start inviting recommenders. If you don't plan on applying until next school year or later, skip this step for now.

How to invite and assign recommenders:

1. From the My Colleges tab select a college and open their "Recommenders and FERPA" section.
2. If you have not done so already, you will need to complete the [FERPA Release Authorization](#).
3. Invite recommenders using the invite button from each section. You may also use the "Invite Recommenders" button at the top.
4. Select the type of invitation you would like to send. For each invitation you will need information like their name and email address.
5. After you add a recommender, you can view their info using the Manage Recommenders button.
6. Note that teachers, parents, and other recommenders will not receive an email invitation until you assign them to a college. To assign these recommenders, go to their section within this screen. Select their name from the dropdown and use the assign button.
7. If your high school uses Naviance or another partner software, you will not invite your counselor or teachers here. There will be instructional text on this page explaining what to do next. You will still add other recommenders and advisors using the steps above.

In general, each college has their own recommendation requirements. For example, one college may need two teacher recommendations. Some colleges may not want any teacher recommendations. Colleges can also determine what kinds of other recommenders they want. Some may allow for any recommender type, whereas others only allow an employer recommendation.
