101 Foundations of Restorative Justice Practices for School Counselors, Social Workers, and Other School-Based Mental Health Professionals (\$200 – Includes light breakfast, lunch and resources)

This session engages participants in the foundational concepts and framework of Restorative Justice Practices through an experiential learning process. School counselors, social workers, and other school-based mental health professionals can be described as the "connective tissue" of school communities. They are often called on to support social and emotional well-being, respond to crises, and connect students and staff to critical resources among many other tasks. In this session, participants will learn strategies for integrating restorative approaches in their daily work including but not limited to building relationships, leading individual sessions, running small groups, leading conflict mediation, and creating a healthy school climate for students, staff and community members.
