8.	If TSAC MCS eligibility is lost, the student will be responsible for all dual enrollment tuition costs in subsequent semesters which will be added to the student's balance.
9.	Failure to pay balances by the fee deadline can result in your student being removed from VSCC courses. Failure to pay fees can result in holds on the student's account that prevent registration or the issuance of transcripts. Current balances are viewable on the student's My Vol State portal.
10.	Regardless of age, enrollment at VSCC makes your child a college student. Per federal law (FERPA), all correspondence (including bills) will be addressed to the student.
11.	It is the student's responsibility to contact the instructor with any questions or concerns about courses. Instructors will correspond with students only.
