
Important End Of The Year Announcements

5TH CRADE

All year long, our 5th graders have navigated the vast ocean of learning, diving deep into new concepts and riding the waves of discovery. As the school year comes to a close, they're surfacing with confidence. ready to showcase the treasures of knowledge they've gathered along the way! We are excited for students to showcase their learning on end of the year assessments. We will wrap up the school year with various ELA projects focusing on character development, main idea, and theme. In Social Studies, students will engage in a review of all six units and demonstrate their learning through presentations. Students will wrap up Math by learning to plot and generate patterns on a coordinate system. We are so proud of the growth students have shown this school year. We hope everyone has a great summer! In Science, students will finish with learning about stars, their apparent motion, and why we see different stars in different seasons.



4th GRADE

In our final Science Module, students have been learning about light and how physical properties of an object affect how much light reflects to our eyes. We have been exploring theories for why Amelia Earhart had a hard time finding Howland Island on the last leg of her journey around the world. Students are pictured creating a model of Howland Island so that they can test the conditions of her flight.

In our final Math module, students have been learning about Geometry. They have learned to name and label figures, measure angles, and write equations to find the measure of unknown angles in a figure.

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




There are only a few weeks left to explore our creativity in art. Our last few projects have been landscapes using texture plates, and we have also delved into radial symmetry. First, students used a circle of paper to divide into equal parts to begin their design. Math became part of our lesson as we folded our paper circle into a half, then fourths, and finally one more fold to create eighths. Then, students used letters, numbers or both to repeat eight times to create a radial symmetrical piece of art. Since working with radial symmetry and circles, we transitioned to circle weaving using a paper plate. It has been a joy to teach the students at R. J. Vial during the 2024-2025 school year. I look forward to exploring new art techniques next school year.

NURSE'S NOTES May 2025

End of Year Information & Reminders:

If you have a child with medication checked in at school, you will need to come to school to sign out and pick up that medication. Please do so during the last week of school.

If your child will need medication at school next school year, please obtain a medication packet from the office. These forms are to be filled out by you and your child's doctor on or after July 1st, 2025. You must bring in the new orders with the medication appropriately labeled by the pharmacist at the beginning of school in August.

If your child has any changes in his/her medical history over the summer, please remember to update the school nurse at the start of the new school year and provide proper medical documentation if necessary. Medical issues that the school should be aware of include asthma and the use of an inhaler, diabetes, severe allergic reactions that require Benadryl and/or Epipen, seizure disorder, heart conditions, special diets, and any other type of medical diagnosis or special needs. We highly recommend communication with the school and school nurse for the safety and health of your child.

Please check to make sure your child is up-to-date on all required vaccines/immunizations. Immunizations are required at ages 4, 11, and 16 years. If necessary, have your child obtain the required shots over the summer break to avoid the possibility of exclusion in the fall.
