## Teachers Eligible for Tenure Pending Board of Education Approval

May 2017

Teachers are eligible for tenure in Tennessee when they have completed a probationary teaching period of 5 years (45 months) within a seven year period and have received TEAM evaluation composite scores (overall Level of Effectiveness score) of 4 (above expectations) or 5 (significantly above expectations) for the last two years of the probationary period as a non-tenured teacher (Tennessee Code Annotated 49-5-503). The Tennessee Department of Education finalized TEAM scores for 2015-16 in December of 2016; this has delayed tenure determinations until now. Once we received the final scores, we reviewed service time and TEAM ratings of our educators to determine who is eligible for tenure. Please note that there are a few educators who should have received Tenure for their service and scores from the previous school years.

We are pleased to present the following educators (92) below for tenure. Their commitment to the district and outstanding performance in the classroom makes them more than worthy for this honor:
