

All students being transported on school buses must be considerate of the safety and well-being of fellow passengers. Misconduct on a school bus can distract the driver's attention from his/her primary responsibility of safely transporting students. The same standards of student conduct that apply in school also apply on a school bus. Students must adhere to the following when riding on a school bus:

1. Sit in assigned seat (state requirement), if applicable.
2. Show respect for the driver at all times.
3. Enter and leave the bus in an orderly fashion.
4. Be seated while the bus is in motion.
5. Wear seat belts if they are provided.
6. Keep the bus clean – no littering or eating on the bus.
7. No fighting, pushing, hitting, excessive mischief, or use of inappropriate/profane language.
8. Keep hands, arms, heads, etc. inside the bus at all times.
9. Follow all Bus Safety Rules as explained below.

N.J. State School Law, Chapter 18A:25-2 states: "A pupil may be excluded from the bus for disciplinary reasons by the principal and his parents shall provide for his transportation to and from school during the period of such exclusion."
